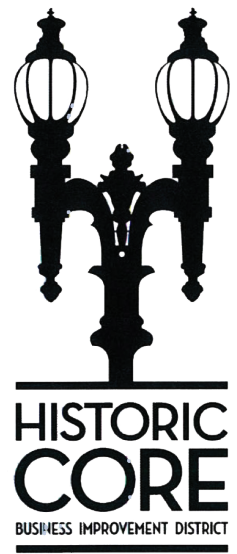
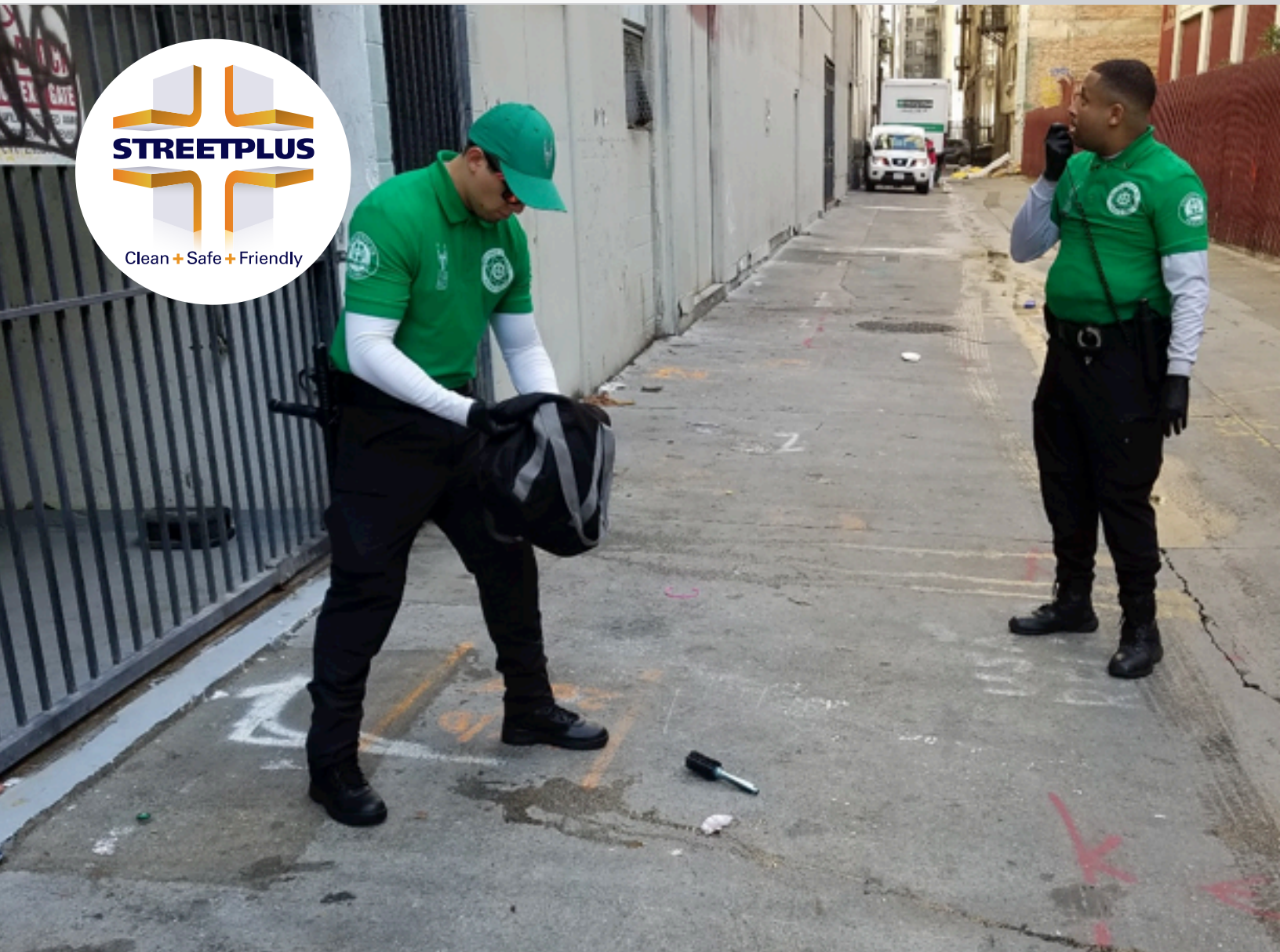


Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | JANUARY 2019



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in January 2019. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

January 5, 2019 - At approximately 1330 hours, Officer Solorio and Officer Ajaa received a service call regarding an intoxicated individual at 628 South Broadway street. Upon arrival, public safety officers were able to locate the suspect right outside the store. At this point in time, officers noticed the individual becoming hostile towards customers coming in and out of the store. Officers then attempted to approach the individual in order to deescalate the situation. As soon as Officer Solorio and Ajaa took a step towards the suspect, he then took a combative stance against our officers. The suspect was then given numerous commands to step down. Refusing to cooperate, our officers decided to act quickly and apprehend the individual. LAPD was notified shortly after and took the suspect in for public intoxication.

January 7, 2019- While on his regular foot patrol, Officer Ajaa was flagged down by a pedestrian claiming that there was a fire in the alley. Officer Ajaa acted quickly and was able to locate the source of the fire (dumpster). Officer Ajaa then called LAFD and evacuated any pedestrians who were within close proximity of the alley. LAFD arrived on scene 4 minutes later and was able to extinguish the fire. Officer's Ajaa presence and quick actions was enough to assist LAFD in extinguishing the fire.

January 14, 2019 - At approximately 0910, Captain Pacheco, Sergeant Guzman, and Officer Sanchez witnessed the security guard from 220 W 5th street, chase an individual through traffic heading eastbound on 5th street. The foot pursuit ended right by The Last Bookstore. Upon making contact with both of the individuals, public safety officers observed what appeared to be an unknown substance on the security guard's face. When questioned about the events, the security guard stated that the individual threw a bottle at his face. He also stated that he would like to press charges. Once we directed our attention towards the suspect to explain the situation, he then fled on foot traveling eastbound once more. Captain Pacheco and Sergeant Guzman engaged in a short foot pursuit and ended up apprehending the individual in front of 460 S Spring street. LAPD was notified by officer Sanchez and dispatched shortly after. The suspect was then booked for a battery charge and transported to LAPD's central division.

January 18, 2019 - At around 1430 hours, Officer Sanchez received a service call regarding an individual who appeared to be under the influence. Once Officer Sanchez arrived at the location, he was able to identify the suspect which in this point in time decided to strip away his clothes. Officer Sanchez then notified LAPD. While waiting for a unit to arrive, Officer Sanchez attempted to reason with the suspect who was under the influence by handing him a blanket. After several attempts, the suspect decided to cooperate and cover himself up momentarily. LAPD arrived shortly after and took the individual in for indecent exposure. Officer Sanchez's patience helped deescalate the situation until LAPD arrived.

January 26, 2019- Officer Ramirez and Officer Ramos were on their routine patrol when they noticed a big brawl break out at the 500th block of Spring Street at around 0020 hours. Public safety officers notified LAPD right away and helped provide crowd control once backup arrived. As a result, LAPD was able to apprehend two individuals that night. Our officers uniform presence helped LAPD conduct crowd control among one of the busiest blocks in the district.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

January 21, 2019 - At approximately 1200 hours, Captain Pacheco and Officer Perchlak observed an individual traveling on his bike heading southbound towards the 600th block of Spring Street. Upon closer examination, public safety officers were able to identify multiple illegal items in his bike basket. These items ranged from brass knuckles, tasers, pocket knives, pepper spray, and other miscellaneous objects. Public safety officers observed the suspects movement and dialogue with the film crew security. Shortly after, officers were able to establish the fact that the suspect was riding around the district and attempting to sell these items to other security personnel. LAPD was dispatched and arrived on scene 15 minutes later. Captain Pacheco explained the situation to LAPD which resulted in a small field investigation. As a result, LAPD arrested the individual for the possession and sales of illegal weapons. Our officers' quick decisive actions were crucial in keeping illegal weapons off the street.

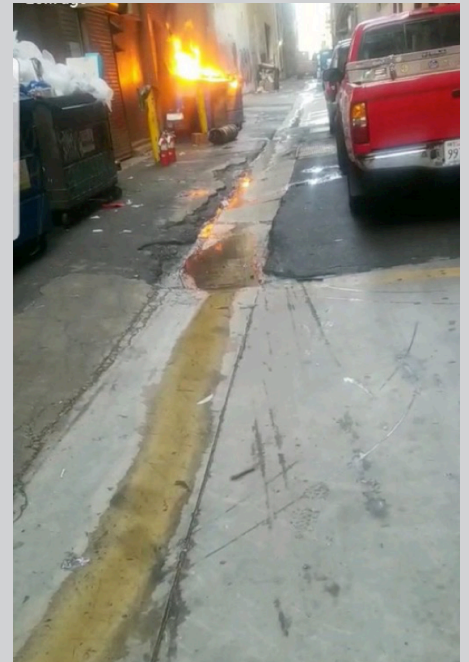

This individual was detained by our officers for public intoxication/aggressive. (See incident on January 05)



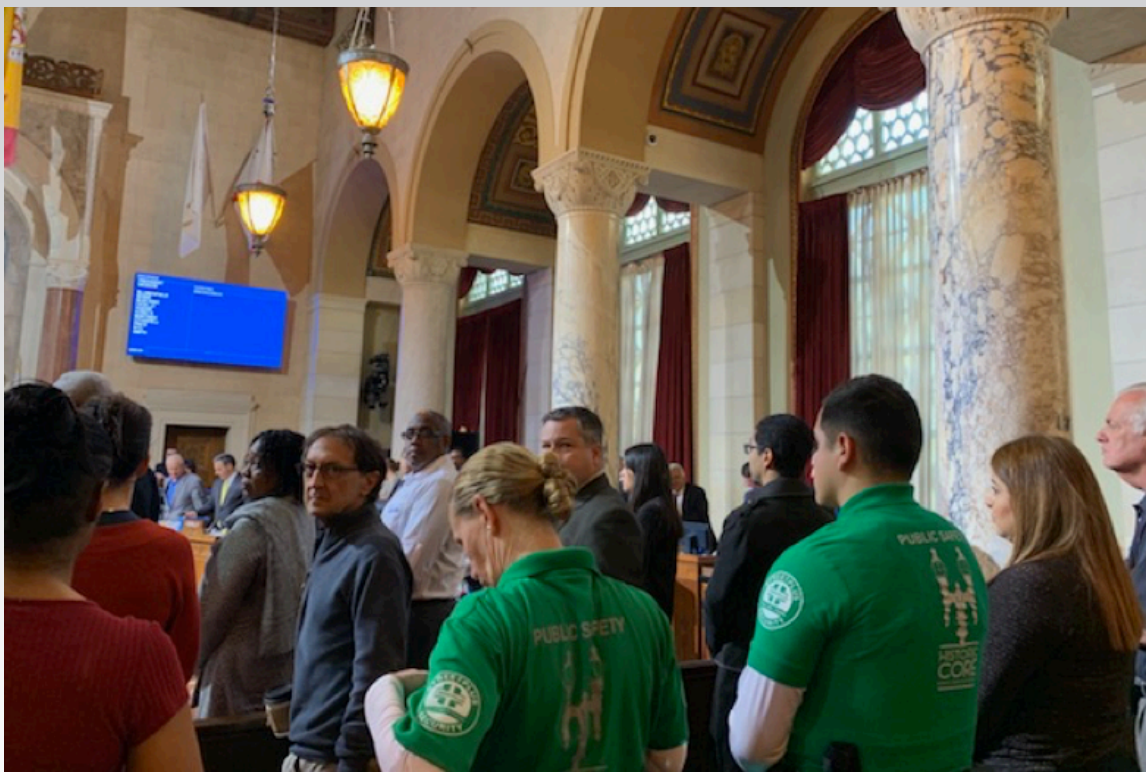
LAPD is pictured here arresting an individual for indecent exposure. (See incident on January 18)
