

# Street Report

The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in January 2020. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**January 5, 2020** - While on his routine patrol, Sergeant Guzman received a call at about 10:30am regarding an individual coming in and out of traffic on the corner of 6th and Spring. Upon arrival, Sergeant Guzman was able to locate the individual and attempted to get him out of the street. The subject refused to comply and continued to disrupt traffic. A secondary call was placed to LAPD for assistance. LAPD arrived on scene and took the suspect into custody. It was then determined by an LAPD supervisor that the suspect will be placed on a 5150 hold.

**January 6, 2020** - At around 0800 hours, Sergeant Guzman and Officer Carmona were on their routine patrol when a Chrysalis employee flagged them down on 6th and Broadway. While making contact, it was determined that the maintenance worker was assaulted by a transient who was a couple of feet away. LAPD was contacted and responded within a few minutes. Once the LAPD officers arrived on scene, they were able to quickly locate the suspect and apprehend him for battery charges.

**January 11, 2020** - At about 0730 hours, Officer Castaneda was flagged down by a Metro Bus driver in front of the historic core office. The bus driver stated that a transient got on the bus but was refused service due to insufficient funds. Out of rage, the transient threw an object to the bus which caused minor damage to the windshield. Officer Castaneda made a report but also notified LAPD. The Metro Bus driver was also told to notify his immediate supervisor. No injuries were reported at the time.

**January 20, 2020** - At approximately 0030 hours Sergeant Ramirez and Officer Sweeney were patrolling the district when they noticed a helicopter hovering over 4th and Los Angeles street. Upon arrival, LAPD had the scene tapped off due to a possible suicide inside one of the residential units. Sergeant Ramirez and Officer Sweeney were tasked by LAPD to provide minor crowd control due to a small gathering. LAPD cleared them from the scene after more LAPD units arrived on scene.

**January 20, 2020** - At approximately 2245 hours, public safety officers received numerous calls about shots fired within the 600th block of Spring Street. LAPD was also notified by the callers and public safety officers. By the time public safety officers arrived LAPD was already on scene with a heavy presence. Sergeant Ramirez and Sergeant Perchlak were tasked by LAPD to assist with the crowd that was forming around the crime scene. No suspects were found and no injuries were reported through the incident.

**January 26, 2020** - While on patrol at approximately 0230 hours, Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney noticed a large LAFD presence on the 500th block of Spring street. LAPD advised Ramirez that a stabbing had occurred and they were in search of possible suspects. The initial victim was treated at the scene for minor stab wounds. The victim was being cooperative with LAPD and transported in stable condition. An extensive search was conducted by LAPD in which they found no suspects.

#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**January 31, 2020** - A suspicious van had been parked for the past few days over at 524 South Broadway. Public safety officers conducted surveillance of the van and were able to locate the owner of the vehicle that same day. While no contact was made, public safety officers continue to monitor the individual's activity that day and noticed that he was causing a disturbance among other merchants on that block. LAPD was dispatched through the non-emergency line. Once LAPD officers arrived, they ran the license plate of the van and the identification of the person. Both reports came back as missing. LAPD took the individual in due to the missing persons report and left his van on scene for another family member to pick up.
