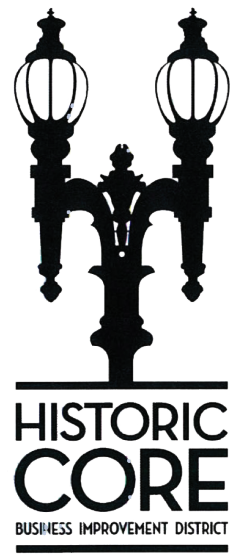


Street Report

The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in March 2020. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

March 01, 2020 - At approximately 1000 hours, officer Carmona was on his routine patrol of the 600th block of Main street when he noticed numerous items on the street. Upon further inspection, Carmona found the subject who caused the mess and advised him to gather his belongings and vacate the area. The subject was a bit hesitant at first but complied moments later, gathered his belongings, and left the area. Officer Carmona's persistence was key in removing the excess number of items off the street.

March 09, 2020 - At around 0400 hours, Sergeant Perchak and officer Marquez received a notification from the citizen app about possible shots fired over at 315 W 5th street. Being extremely cautious, officers went ahead and responded to the call. LAPD was already on scene and was assessing the situation. After further review, it was then determined to be a false call. Although it was a false call, BID officers maintain a level of readiness when dealing with any type of situation.

March 11, 2020 - Sergeant Ramos received a service call at about 1715 hours regarding a woman who was vandalizing property. Sergeant Ramos made contact with the property manager at 5th and Main and was able to obtain a description of the woman in question. LAPD was also dispatched to the scene for the initial report. After scouting the area, it was then determined that the woman was no longer in the district. The maintenance team was also dispatched to scene and was able to remove most of the graffiti off the wall.

March 13, 2020 - While on patrol, Captain Pacheco and Sergeant Ramirez noticed two shattered windows at 560 S Main street. Officers quickly notified the maintenance team and LAPD as well. While on scene BID officers talked to two undercover LAPD officers who witnessed the crime from across the street. The two officers confirmed that the suspect was apprehended down the block by a marked PD unit. The property manager was also notified and suggested by the BID and PD to board up the windows of the vacant business.

March 15, 2020 - At approximately 2310 hours, Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney noticed a couple of LAPD units at 545 S Main street. Upon making contact, BID officers confirmed that LAPD was conducting a DUI investigation. BID officers remained on scene to deter unwanted foot traffic. A few minutes later, LAPD went ahead and arrested a woman due to drunk driving. Once BID officers resumed patrol, they went ahead and notified nearby patrons at bars about the dangers of drinking and driving.

March 23, 2020 - While on patrol at approximately 0600 hours, Sergeant Guzman and Officer Thomas came across an attempted break in at 620 S Broadway. The suspect shattered one window but showed no sign of entry. The suspect was gone by the time BID officers and LAPD arrived on scene. LAPD took the initial report and checked CCTV for possible footage of the suspect. Luckily for the business owner, the suspect was unable to gain entry due to the reinforced glass that was installed last year.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

March 07, 2020 - Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney were on their routine patrol when they both came across debris next to 610 S Main street at around 0030 hours. While inspecting the debris, Sergeant Ramirez noticed a hidden machete. Sergeant Ramirez contacted LAPD right away and notified them of their findings. LAPD arrived on scene and booked the machete as unclaimed property. Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney's vigilance helped remove a dangerous weapon of the street that could have been claimed by anyone passing by.



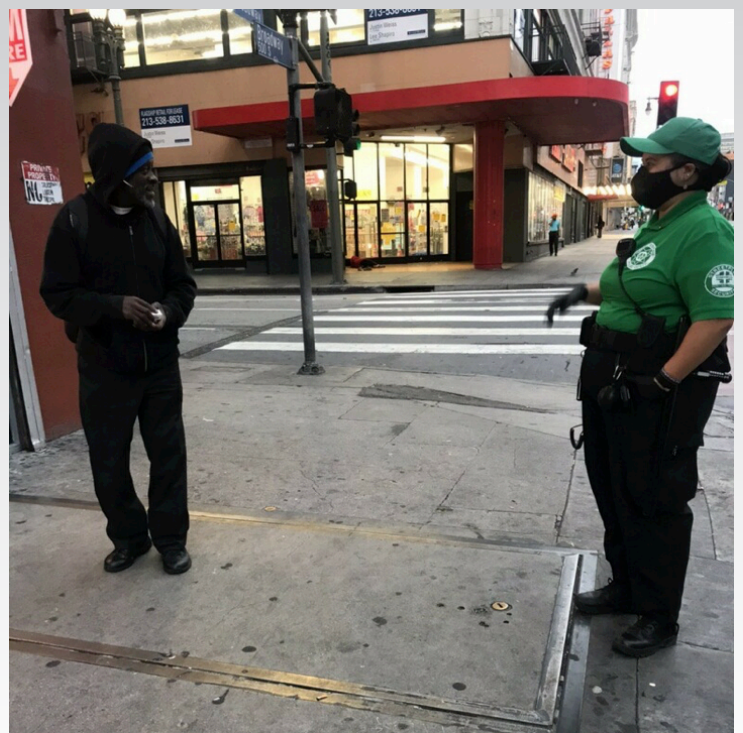
Sergeant Guzman is seen here directing oncoming traffic.



Hand sanitizer is an effective way to kill off germs in your hands. The BID alongside with the city distributed bottles of hand sanitizers to the people of Historic Core.



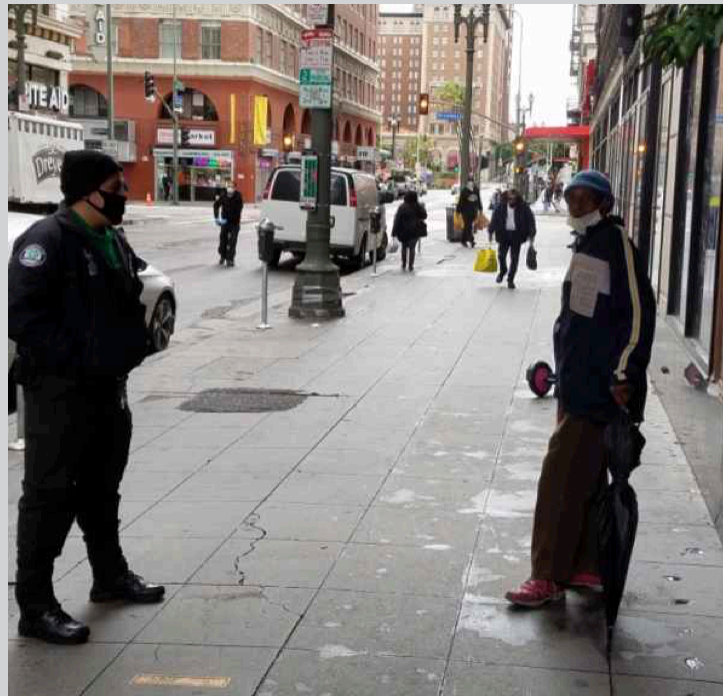
Rain, shine, or times of crisis officers are patrolling the district 24/7.



When engaging in conversations, officers ensure to maintain a safe distance while wearing PPE.



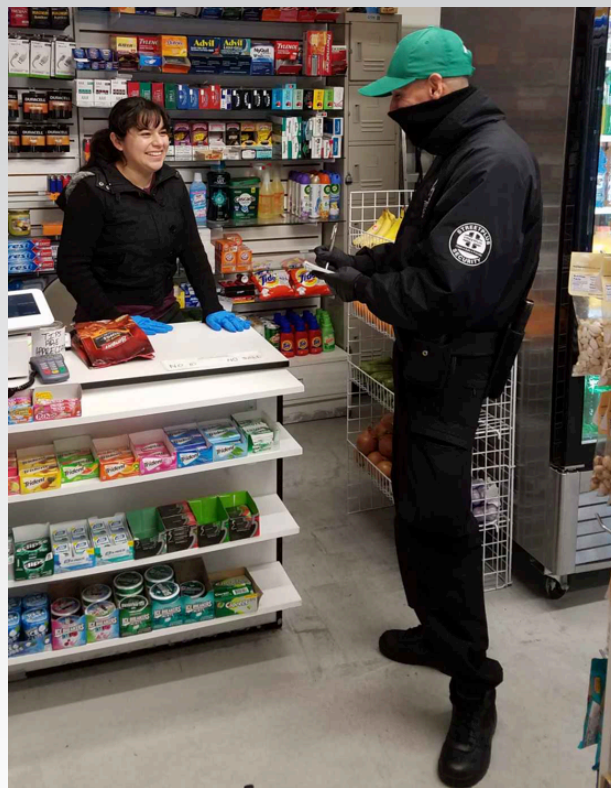
Even on sunny days, officers ensure to wear PPE at all times.



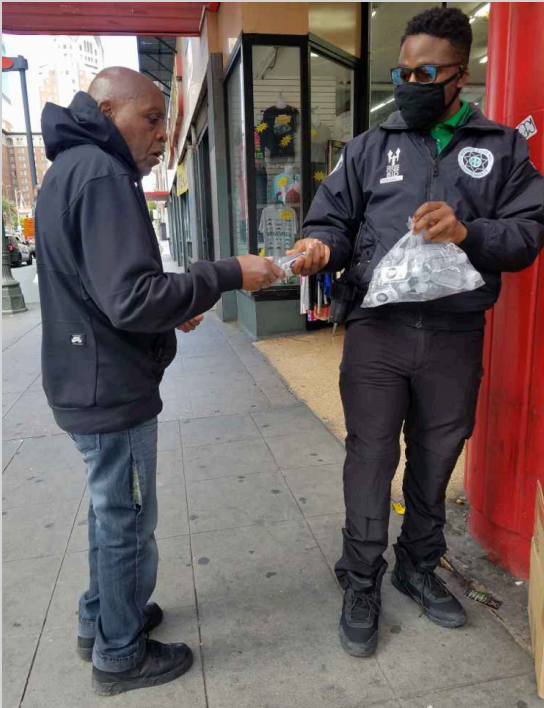
Officers can also be seen on the street promoting social distancing.



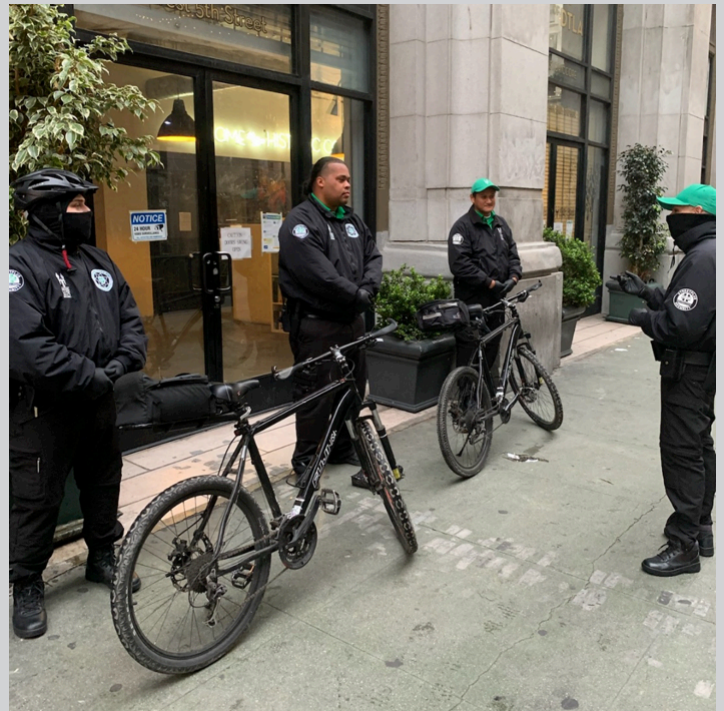
Officer Carmona conducts his routine patrol check at the park with their security personnel.



Officers routinely check in with the few shops that remain open during the pandemic.



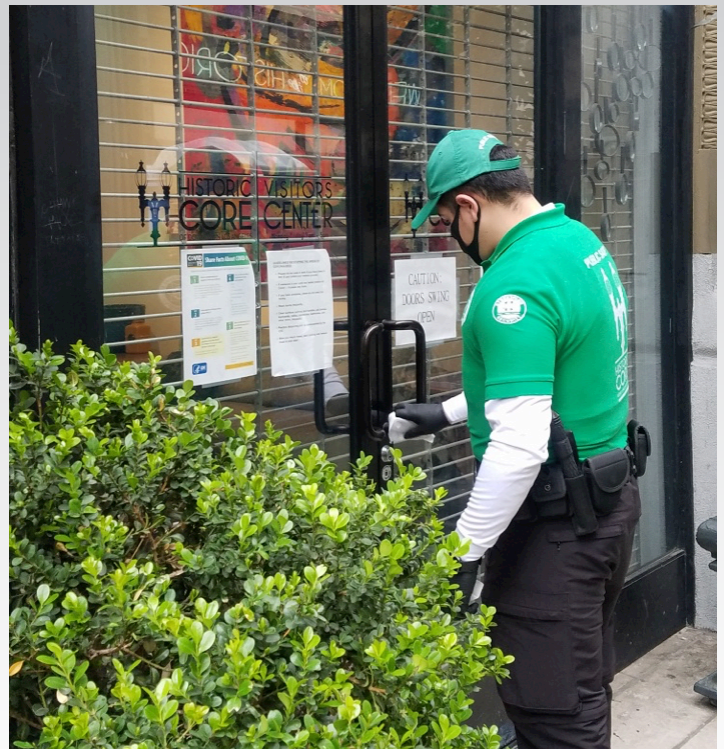
Officer Aja assisted city hall in the distribution of hand sanitizers.
