


Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | APRIL 2019



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in April 2019. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.



Blair Besten and Captain Jose Pacheco were present to receive an award on behalf of the Historic Core BID for exceptional service. This award was presented by the nonprofit organization, changing paths.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

April 3, 2019 - At approximately 2250 hours, Sergeant Ballew along with his trainee, Officer Thomas, responded to a service call regarding a woman who had barricaded herself inside the restroom of Mezcalero over at 510 South Broadway. Upon arrival, our public safety officers attempted to open the door but appeared to be closed shut. Noting this observation, Sergeant Ballew contacted LAPD for backup. While LAPD was in route, our public safety officers attempted to gain compliance through verbal commands. Sure enough, after 10 minutes of conversating, our public safety officers were able to convince the woman to open the door. Once the door was open, our public safety officers proceeded with caution and escorted the woman off the premises. LAPD arrived shortly after and gathered statements from all parties. The owner decided to not press charges but sue the woman due to damages inside of the restroom.

April 8, 2019 - At about 1050 hours, Sergeant Guzman and Officer Sanchez received a service call regarding a disruptive male at the corner of 6th and Broadway. Upon arrival, the gentleman was cooperative and obeyed all of our officer's commands. Within seconds, the gentleman decided to strike officer Guzman multiple times before running southbound on Broadway. Sergeant Guzman was able to call out a broadcast in which Captain Pacheco responded. Once Captain Pacheco arrived on scene, he and Sergeant Guzman procced to arrest the individual without incident. LAPD was flagged down by officer Sanchez seconds later. After all public safety officers were interview, LAPD took the suspect in for battery. Sergeant Guzman was not injured and decided to press charges as a result.

April 11, 2019 - At 1020 hours, Captain Pacheco assisted Oscar from the cleaning crew in clearing out the bus bench for a power wash. In doing so, a known trainset by the name of "K.C" returned to the scene 5 mins after with a deep laceration in his abdominal area. K.C had been stabbed. Captain Pacheco immediately cleared the scene and requested for backup while LAPD and LAFD were dispatched to the scene. All parties responded in just under 6 mins. The quick response time was just enough to stabilize the stabbing victim while transporting him to the hospital.

April 19, 2019 - While responding to a service call at

0940 hours, Sergeant Ramos and Officer Sanchez noticed a disoriented individual located in front of 439 south Broadway. When attempting to make contact with the individual, the suspect decided to swing his fist at both officers without hesitation. Sergeant Ramos was quick to deflect the swing while taking the individual down to the ground. A small struggle ensued, but Sergeant Ramos and Officer Sanchez were able to arrest the individual without harm. LAPD was dispatched to the scene where it was later determined that the individual was under the influence. No parties were hurt during the incident in which officers were cleared from the scene shortly after.

April 23, 2019 - At approximately 0100 hours, Sergeant Ramirez along with Trainee Juarez were on their routine patrol when they noticed two individuals tagging on the side of a building. Sergeant Ramirez advised both parties to stop what they were doing and to sit down against the wall. LAPD was contacted in which they arrived moments after. After talking to all parties involved LAPD cited the two individuals and advised them to not return to the district.

April 27, 2019 - While on their routine patrol, Sergeant Ramos and Officer Solorio noticed a couple of street closures within the district due to a possible march. After confirming that the march was going to occur, our officers assisted DOT with crowd control while the march crossed over through our district. After the march concluded, public safety officers continued to maintain uniform presence throughout the district.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

April 30, 2019 - Our outreach coordinator had her first successful story of the year by helping out a known transient by the name of Angel. After establishing a personal connection, Lisa Myers was able to inform Angel of all the resources that were available to her. After numerous meetings, it was then determined that Angel wanted to return to her hometown in Utah. Lisa worked effortlessly around the clock to ensure that she equipped Angel with all of the information that she needed in order to return home. After 3 weeks of planning, Angel was able to get on a greyhound bus in route to her hometown in Utah. We were able to get confirmation later in the day once the greyhound bus arrived to its destination. Angel was able to confirm that she was in Utah along with a couple of family members that were waiting for her.




