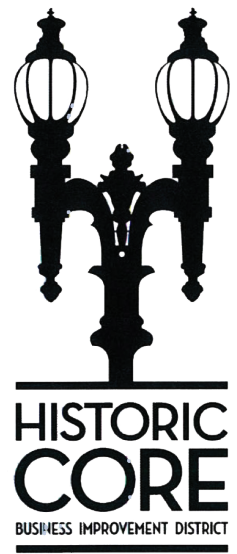


# Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | AUGUST 2019



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in August 2019. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**August 3, 2019** - At approximately 0220 hours, Sergeant Ramirez and officer Benson were flagged down by down and out security over on 5th and Spring. Security notified officers that a woman had been hit by car that took off from the scene immediately. Sergeant Ramirez provided preliminary aid while Officer Benson placed a call to LAFD. LAFD arrived within minutes and assessed the victim. The victim complained about moderate pain. LAFD ended up transporting the victim to the nearest hospital for minor injuries. Sergeant Ramirez and officer Benson's care was enough to keep the victim at ease that day.

**August 6, 2019** - August 6th was the national night out event where multiple PD agencies across Southern California participated. Our team set up a booth at Pershing square and handed out flyers and information. The event was a success as a variety of people walked away with further knowledge about the BID industry and the public safety team. By engaging with the community, officers were able to clear common misconceptions and educate the public.

**August 8, 2019** - At 2030 hours, Sergeant Ramirez, officer Benson, and officer Sweeney were responding to a service call over at Cecil alley regarding a possible vandalism act. Upon arrival, officers were able to locate the individual in question and confronted him about his actions. The suspect began acting erratically and appeared to be under the influence. At this point, the suspect decided to take out a knife on Sergeant Ramirez and Officer Sweeney. Officer Sweeney deployed his mace while Sergeant Ramirez subdued the hostile individual. Officer Benson placed a call to LAPD who arrived within seconds. Once the suspect was evaluated by LAPD, he was taken into custody for vandalism and brandishing. Our officers' courageous acts were enough to remove a dangerous individual off the streets that night.

**August 17, 2019** - At approximately 2030 hours, Sergeant Ramirez, officer Solorio, and officer Castaneda responded to a service call at the last book store located on the 500th block of Spring Street. Upon arrival officers were notified by the merchant that the individual pushed a customer inside of the store. Officers then

made contact with the customer to confirm if she was pressing charges. Once officers were cleared, they then proceeded to make the detainment. After successfully detaining the suspect, LAPD was contacted in which they took custody of the suspect. A private person's arrest form was filled out on behalf of the victim. LAPD booked the suspect on battery charges that day.

**August 23, 2019** - While patrolling 4th and Broadway, Sergeant Ramirez and Officer Sweeney noticed a fight between two females and one male. Officers quickly intervened and separated both parties. LAPD was also dispatched for further assistance. One of the females had a big lump on her forehead and was treated by LAFD. Unfortunately, all parties were kicked loose by LAPD due to it being ruled as "mutual combat". Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney's presence helped deescalate matters that day which could have gotten worse if it were not for them arriving on time.

**August 24, 2019** - While on their routine patrol Sergeant Ramos, Officer Solorio, and Officer Cruz received a service call about a hostile individual inside of the Dali Llama within the 600th block of spring street. Upon arrival, officers noticed that the individual had barricaded himself inside of the restroom. Officers patiently waited and were able to talk the individual into coming out in just 10mins. Once the suspect came out, he then took a combative stance towards our officers. Without hesitation, all 3 public safety officers subdued the individual with ease. Once LAPD arrived, they were able to book the suspect for attempted battery and trespassing. Our officers quick reaction is essential part of our safety protocol which was executed perfectly that day.

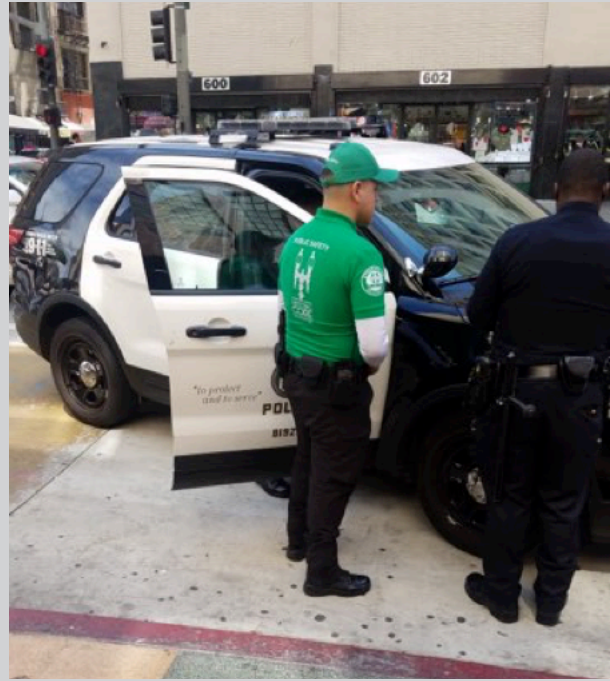
#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

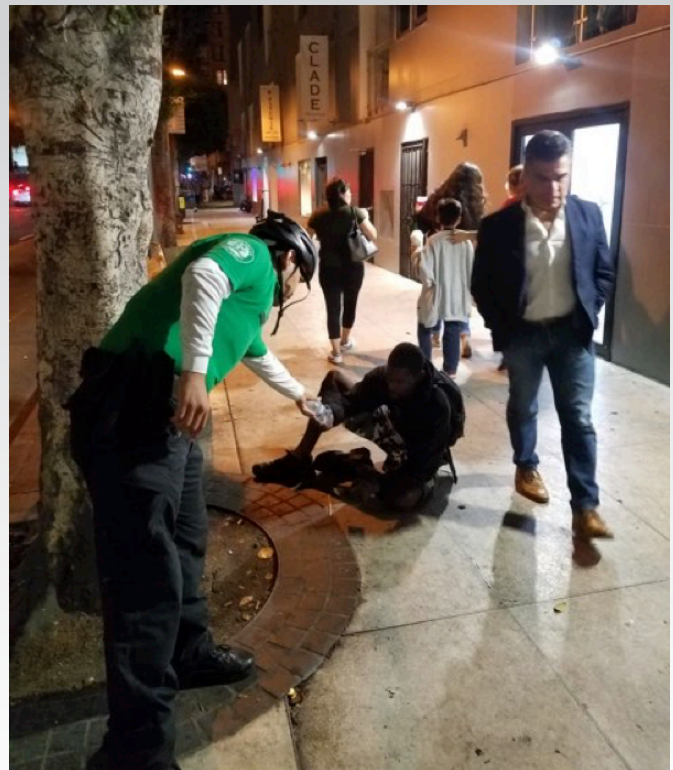

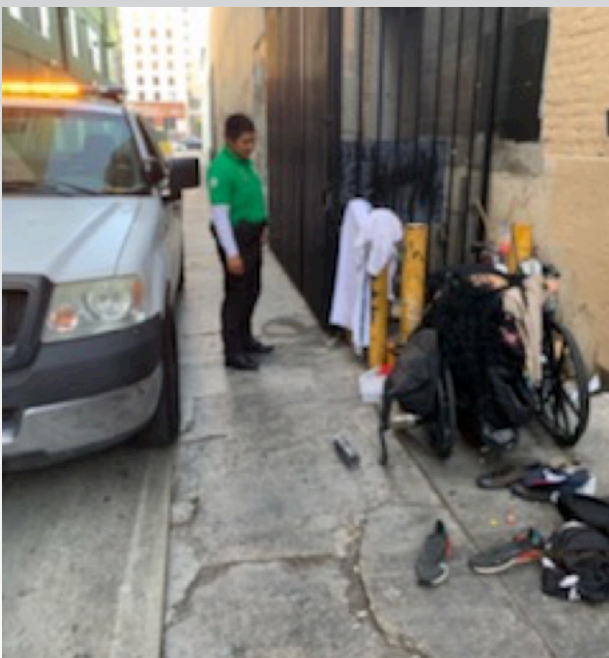
