SAFE AND FRIENDLY | FEBRUARY 2019



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in February 2019. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

February 4, 2019 - At approximately 0700 hours, Sergeant Guzman and officer Sanchez were on their routine patrol when they came across a traffic collision at 622 South Broadway. The traffic collision involved a metro transit bus and a construction truck. Once the scene was determined safe by officers, they then went ahead and proceeded towards the subjects. Everyone stated that no injuries occurred from this collision. LAPD was dispatched and Officers stood by until LAPD arrived at the scene. Our officers assisted with traffic control shortly after. Once all the necessary information was gathered our officers were then cleared from the scene to resume their regular patrol.

February 6, 2019 - At around 0900 hours, Sergeant Guzman and Officer Sanchez located a female individual acting erratically within the corner of 5th and Broadway. Officers evaluated the subject and noticed that she posed a threat to the public (under the influence). LAPD was dispatched and arrived shortly after. Upon LAFD arrival, the individual proceeded to climb the fire truck. Sergeant Guzman and LAPD officer Flores had to physically remove the woman from the fire truck. She was then apprehended with ease and without any injuries. LAPD then transported the individual to a nearby hospital for further examination. Our officer's quick actions assisted LAPD in making and arrest.

February 14, 2019 - While on routine patrol, LAPD officers approached our officers on the field at around 1210 to pass out a wanted flyer. To our surprise, the wanted individual was a well-known transient throughout the district. The transient was wanted on murder charges! We then gathered copies of the wanted flyer and distributed among merchants within the district. Even though the suspect was apprehended a week later, our district worked together in maintaining a vigilant environment for the upcoming days that followed.

February 20, 2019 - At around 1145 hours, Captain Pacheco, Sergeant Guzman, and officer Sanchez were flagged down by a local retail store associate on the corner of 5th and Broadway regarding a possible robbery suspect. Loss prevention from the store had the individual subdued outside the front door but were having a difficult time apprehending the combative individual. At this point in time, we decided to intervene due to the public's safety on the busy walkway. We then proceeded in making the final steps of the arrest with the loss prevention agent's equipment. LAPD arrived on scene shortly after and transported the suspect immediately after a small investigation. Our officer's quick reactions helped regain control of the situation before it spiraled out of control.

February 22, 2019 - While attempting to return our patrol vehicle in its designated parking area, Sergeant Ramirez and Officer Perchlak noticed a severe traffic collision outside our district boundary. Being that our officers were first on the scene, they went ahead and notified Downtown Center BID along with LAPD. Our officers stood by and assisted all parties involved until first responders arrived. All parties were evaluated by LAFD and released shortly after. Our Officers partner up with the other BID officers whenever a situation arises along our boundary.

February 26, 2019 - At approximately 1900 hours, Sergeant Ballew, Corporal Ajaa, and Trainee Juarez observed a code 3 foot pursuit on 5th and Broadway heading northbound. The foot pursuit came to a quick end as the suspect was apprehended seconds after. While LAPD conducted their field investigation, all 3 of our officers assisted with crowd control and traffic control. Our officers uniform presence was enough to deter unwanted traffic during the field investigation. Officers were then cleared from the scene shortly after. The suspect was then transported to central division for booking.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

February 5, 2019 - Officer Sanchez was on his routine patrol when he received a service call at approximately 1015 hours. The call was from the cleaning crew stating that there was a sharp object wrapped around a cloth out in the open. Once officer Sanchez arrived on the scene, he then noticed that the sharp object was an 18-inch machete laying on the ground. Unable to find its recipient, Officer Sanchez quickly recovered the machete from the ground and transported the item back to the station. LAPD was then quickly notified of the discovery and given custody of the recovered weapon. Sanchez's quick actions were extremely helpful this day in recovering an unclaimed weapon and removing it from the streets.
