HISTORIC CORE BID

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

April 02, 2020 - At approximately 0200 hours, Sergeant Ramirez and officer Marquez were on their routine patrol when they noticed a couple of individuals in Cecil Alley. A call was placed to the Fashion BID while officers remained on scene. Fashion BID arrived quickly and approached the group of individuals. Officers Ramirez and Marquez remained on scene in order to offer assistance. Moments later the individuals gathered their belongings and left without incident. Spray cans were found in the alley which possibly belonged to the group.

April 04, 2020 - At around 0700 hours, Sergeant Guzman and Officer Thomas received a call about a possible traffic collision in the corner of 6th and Spring. Upon arrival, LAPD officers were already on scene. The collision was pretty hard since it caused the vehicle to end up on the south eastern sidewalk. Officers Guzman and Thomas provided crowd control and redirect pedestrian traffic. A tow truck was called and it eventually removed the hit vehicle. Both drivers remained on scene while LAPD took the report. Both drivers were unharmed and LAFD was not dispatched for this accident.

April 14, 2020 - Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney were conducting their routing hot spot check at approximately 2215 hours when they noticed a group of 3 men hanging out by the Spring Arcade building. Upon further observations officers saw one of the men fiddling with the rollup door lock. Sergeant Ramirez questioned the individual and determined the group were up to no good. A few moments later the group left without incident and left behind a screwdriver. The pry marks on the lock were consistent with the screw driver. Officers recovered the screwdriver and disposed it with Chrysalis the following morning.

April 16, 2020 - While on patrol, Sergeant Guzman and officer Carmona witnessed a protest cross over into the district at around 1145 hours. The protest appeared to be uber and lyft drivers driving southbound on Broadway and 4th with banners on their vehicles. There were at least 40 cars that participated in this protest. LAPD and BID officers assisted with traffic and crowd control. The protest ended up continuing southbound on Broadway

and resulted in a peaceful event as zero incidents were reported.

April 20, 2020 - At approximately 1530 hours, Sergeant Perchlak and officer Marquez received a service call about a woman impeding traffic at 5th and Broadway. Officers responded to the call and located the woman within seconds. BID officers attempted to give verbal commands but the woman was non-compliant. A secondary call was placed to 911. LAPD and LAFD were dispatched to the scene and arrived within minutes. LAFD attempted to sedate the woman since she showed signs of mental illness. LAPD and BID officers temporarily detained the woman while LAFD assessed her. After the preliminary assessment LAFD put the woman on a gurney and transported her to the nearest facility.

April 23, 2020 - While on patrol at around 2330 hours, Officers Marquez and Carmona received a citizen app notification regarding a man wielding a sword at the corner of 6th and Broadway. BID officers responded to the call and located the man in question. LAPD sirens were heard about a block away which prompted BID officers to wait for the initial contact. LAPD saw the man with the sword and detained him without incident. The sword was confiscated and the man was released once they determined he was not a threat. BID officers remained on scene and waited for the subject to gather his belongings. The subject was last seen gathering his belongings and relocating westbound towards DCBID.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS



BID officers soon learned that LAPD was dealing with a possible shots fired call. LAPD officers went in with tactical equipment while other officers canvased the area. BID officers were posted outside of the building keeping an eye on the back entry. After an extensive search, LAPD found the suspect in question and confirmed that one single round was discharged from a firearm. Fortunately, no one got hurt from the incident. LAPD booked the suspect in for discharging a firearm and transported him once the whole building was searched.








