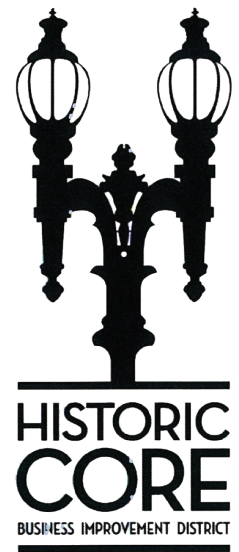


# Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | MARCH 2019



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in March 2019. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**March 5, 2019** - At approximately 0740 hours, Sergeant Guzman and Officer Sanchez observed a stabbing occur within the 800th block of Broadway. It appears that the stabbing was over a verbal altercation between both transients. A service call was placed to 911 while Sergeant Guzman phoned LAPD. Paramedics arrived on scene shortly after and evaluated the victim. No major injuries resulted from the stabbing while the victim refused any medical attention. Shortly after, LAPD was able to locate the suspect a couple of blocks down on Broadway and arrested the transient without incident. Our officers' quick actions were enough to assist the victim and locate a dangerous subject that day.

**March 8, 2019** - At 0640 hours, Officer Sanchez and Corporal Perchlak were flagged down by the security guard who works at 213 W 5th street regarding a suspicious person at Frank Court alley. Upon further inspection, our officers noticed a large katana sword and what appeared to be strange behavior from the individual. After further evaluation, officers placed a call to LAPD to report their findings. Upon arrival, LAPD gave numerous commands to the individual to drop the sword. Refusing to cooperate, LAPD officers were forced to deploy non-lethal tactics in order to subdue the suspect. As a result, LAPD was able to take the individual in without further incident. Our officer's vigilance was key that morning in removing a dangerous person from the streets.

**March 14, 2019** - While on routine patrol, day shift officers Sanchez and Guzman received a service call regarding an individual who vandalized spring street park. Upon further review, officers noticed what appeared to be a racist slogan (swastikas) imprinted on the park way. LAPD was dispatched and arrested the individual for a hate crime. Actions such as this will and shall not be tolerated within the district.

**March 22, 2019** - At around 0230 hours, Sergeant Ramirez along with officer Perchlak noticed 2 male individuals fighting against 1 individual. While phoning LAPD, Sergeant Ramirez

verbally diffused the situation by advising both parties that LAPD was on the way. Upon arrival, LAPD let both parties go due to mutual combat. Thanks to our officers and LAPD, we were able to diffuse a situation that could have gotten worse in a matter of seconds.

**March 27, 2019** - Sergeant Ballew along with Corporal Ajaa, received a service call regarding an individual who was running in and out of traffic at about 1600 hours. While arriving to the scene, our officers were able to locate the suspect in question. While attempting to converse with the individual,

the suspect began to take his clothes off while running in the middle of the street. At this point in time, Sergeant Ballew and Corporal Ajaa were concerned for the well being of the individual which resulted in our officers to detain the suspect. LAPD arrived mins after and transported the individual under a 5150 hold. Our officers quick response and decision making skills were enough to help the transient that day.

**March 28, 2019** - At approximately 2030 hours, Sergeant Ballew and trainee Thomas noticed a young female who appeared to be lost on the corner of 7th and Broadway. When our officers attempted to make contact with the female, she stated that she was lost and that her phone battery died. The female was 14 years of age and looking for her mom. Sergeant Ballew without hesitation took her back to the station and let her use our charging ports to charge her phone. Once the female's phone had enough battery, she was able to call her mom and let her know that she was

waiting for her at our station. The mother quickly arrived 10 minutes after the fact and was able to pick up her daughter. The mother was also very appreciative that we helped her locate her daughter.

#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**March 31, 2019** - We have seen a significant decrease in crime heading towards the end of March. According to LAPD's crime stats report, HCBID has been receiving little to no crime in the district. This can be greatly attributed to our uniform presence during busy days and partnership with LAPD. Our station received an all-time low average of 7 service calls per day.

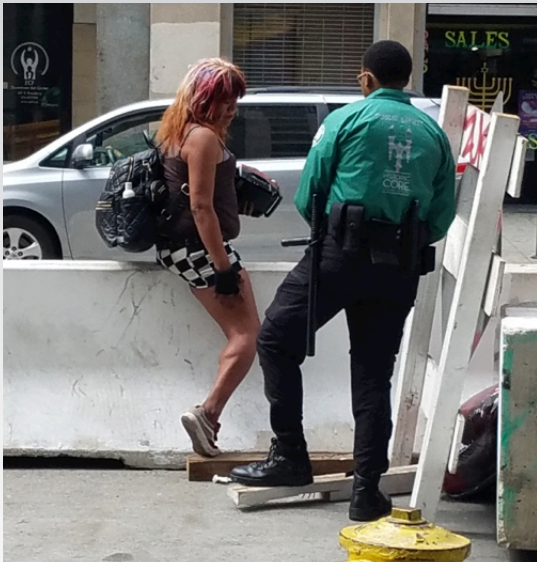
