SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

Jun 03, 2020 - Curfew orders were enacted all throughout the city in an effort to minimize the effects of the unwanted looters. Peaceful demonstrations were able to be seen throughout the city but citizens were warned and advised to follow the curfew regulations. Failure to disperse could have resulted in a fine and/or jail time. LAPD was able to round up numerous protestors after the curfew violation. Most of them were release the following day.

Jun 09, 2020 - Most business and residential areas boarded up their store front windows with wood. The BID office also had their front doors secure during these difficult times. BID officers scouted the district and encouraged other buildings that were not boarded to do the same. BID officers were also making routine contact with building security since May and provided updates as needed. The need for fire extinguishers were also recommended due to the possibility of small fires.

Jun 11, 2020 - Sergeant Ramos and officer Ajaa were on their routine patrol at 6th and Los Angeles when they noticed an erratic driver cutting in and out of his lane. Sergeant Ramos and officer Ajaa were able to evade the driver's motion and proceeded to follow from a safe distance. The driver eventually stopped and entered a building a couple of blocks down. Sergeant Ramos was able to call LAPD and provide as much details as possible. LAPD showed up a couple of minutes later and took the report. LAPD officers advised BID officers that they would forward the report to detectives. BID officers were cleared from the scene shortly after and resumed patrol.

Jun 18, 2020 - While on patrol at 1800 hours, Sergeant Ramos and officer Marquez noticed a huge pile of trash located in front of 532 S Broadway. Officers took pictures and reported the excess amount of trash to the city. A separate call was also placed to Chrysalis. The following day, Sergeant Ramos and officer Castaneda stood by among the 500th block of Broadway around the typical time most businesses close. To their observation, the found a woman from a neighboring store walking to the curb and dumping a fairly sized trash bag. BID officers took video footage of the incident and submitted their findings to the city as well.

Jun 24, 2020 - At approximately 1640 hours, Sergeant Ramos, officer Castaneda, and officer Marquez were on their routine patrol when they came across yellow caution tape at 545 S Main street. As they approached closer to the scene, they found two LAPD units and a body that was covered by a tarp. Sergeant Ramos asked LAPD officers if the person was deceased. LAPD officers confirmed that the victim, a young woman, was deceased and may have possibly overdosed. BID officers then asked if they needed pedestrian traffic rerouted from the area. LAPD officers then notified BID personnel that they had the area under control. BID officers were cleared from the scene minutes later.

June 29, 2020 - While on patrol, at approximately 2330 hours, Sergeant Ramirez and officer Sweeney located a business that may have possibly been burglarized over at 410 S Main street. Sergeant Ramirez cautiously examined the scene and made sure nobody was inside. LAPD was also dispatched for assistance. Upon arrival LAPD also determined there was nobody inside even though the window was broken. A report was made by LAPD and relayed to Senior Lead Officer Joseph. Officer Joseph came by the following morning to ensure there was no criminal activity among the area. Eventually, Chrysalis were able to board up the window and secure the building.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

June 05, 2020 - The national guard maintained a heavy presence throughout the historic core corridor. Units could be seen covering busy intersections on Spring street and Broadway street. Not only did their presence deter looters and rioters, the national guard was also seen engaging in casual conversations with the public. The public along with the BID were extremely grateful in having the military's assistance during rough times. The troops also assisted LAPD with additional assignments that pertained to the riots of downtown Los Angeles.






