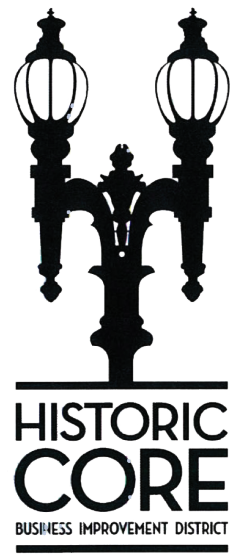


# Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | OCTOBER 2020



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in October 2020. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**October 5th, 2020** - At approximately 2200 hours, BID officers were on their assigned patrol when they noticed a large crowd of protestors traveling southbound on spring street. BID officers were able to locate LAPD as well since they were following close by. LAPD units assured BID officers that the protest was code 4 and that their direction of travel was towards pershing square. BID officers followed the protestors close by until they passed through the district. The incident was a success since there was no vandalism acts or property damage to report.

**October 11th, 2020** - While on patrol, at approximately 0610 hours, BID officers received a citizen app notification regarding a disturbed man attempting to commit suicide. Sergeant Perchlak and Sergeant Ramirez responded and were the first on the scene. LAPD and LAFD arrived shortly after. BID officers were then tasked by LAPD to conduct traffic control within the busy intersection. Within minutes, LAPD was able to diffuse the situation by talking to the man and having him surrender. LAFD then conducted a preliminary assessment and transported the individual for a 72-hour hold.

**October 13th, 2020** - While on patrol, BID officers noticed a huge LAPD presence at 510 S Spring street. BID officers then made contact with LAPD and confirmed that one person was shot on scene. The victim was transported to the nearest hospital with unknown injuries. LAPD conducted a heavy investigation and cleared the scene moments after. LAPD officers advised BID officers to be on high alert due to the increased number of incidents regarding firearm discharges in that area. BID officers also passed the information along to nearby businesses and security personnel.

**October 16th, 2020** - At approximately 2030 hours, Officer Ajaa and Officer Marquez were conducting a hot spot check when they noticed a few fire engines arrive on scene at 548 s spring street. LAFD personnel confirmed that there was a small fire that broke out. The cause of the fire was due to a cigarette that was improperly disposed. Officer Ajaa and Officer Marquez stood by to ensure the scene was secure. LAFD extinguished the small fire instantaneously and cleared the scene shortly after.

**October 22nd, 2020** - At around 1000 hours, Sergeant Ramirez and officer Carmona received a service call regarding and unresponsive individual. When BID officers

arrived on scene, they noticed the individual was having a difficult time moving and a hard time breathing. A call was placed to LAFD paramedics within seconds. LAFD arrived shortly after and assessed the individual. LAFD ultimately determined that the man was in desperate need of medical attention. LAFD then transported the individual to the nearest hospital and thanked BID officers for taking the appropriate actions. Their assistance was key in bringing in the necessary medical resources.

**October 26th, 2020** - At about 0605 hours, Sergeant Perchlak and officer Pirir heard a loud bang around the corner on 6th and Los Angeles. Upon arrival, BID officers noticed a single vehicle collision. The vehicle had jumped the curb and crashed the side wall of 560 s Los Angeles street. The driver of the vehicle complained of minor pain and requested paramedics. BID officers told the driver to stay put and contacted LAFD as well as LAPD. Both agencies responded and assisted the man who had minor injuries. LAPD conducted their own investigation and ruled out any foul play. The cause of the crash was most likely due to the driver being drowsy. The driver was released on the scene after her was treated by LAFD. The vehicle sustained moderate damages while the building received minor damages.

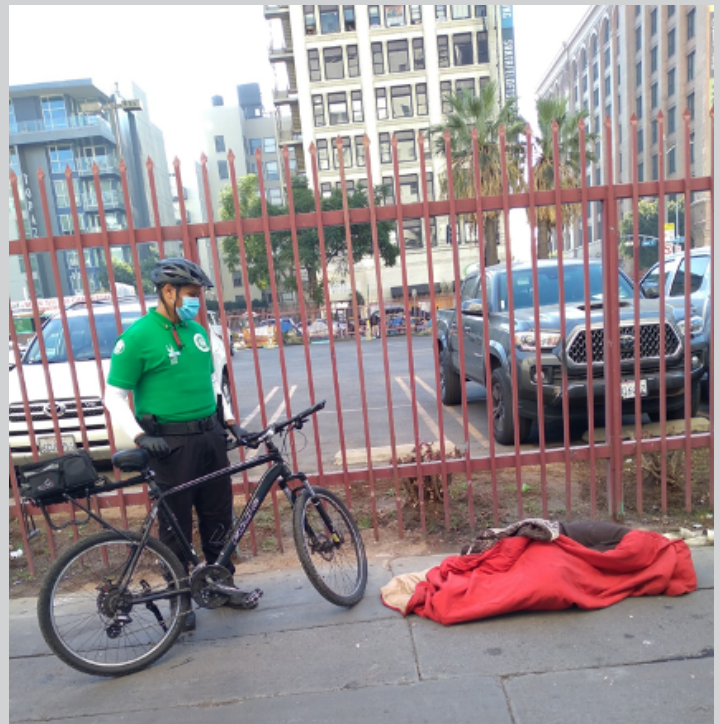
#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**October 17th, 2020** - At 1500 hours, Sergeant Ramos received a citizen app notification regarding a vehicle theft that occurred in the fashion district. It was then confirmed through police dispatch that there were two occupants in the car at the time of the vehicle theft. A city-wide bolo was put out in an effort to locate the suspect and the two victims. BID officers distributed the information to all the nearby businesses and residences in an effort to locate the vehicle. Not long throughout the day, at approximately 1632 hours, the vehicle was located by LAPD officers and resulted in a short vehicle pursuit. The pursuit came to an end at 6th and spring. LAPD apprehended the suspect after a short foot chase. The 2 victims were also located inside of the vehicle with no injuries. BID officers were also on scene and assisted with crowd and traffic control. It was a great outcome due to the status of the victims and the reunion they had with family members shortly after. The family was very gracious to all agencies for going the extra mile and capturing the violent criminal.

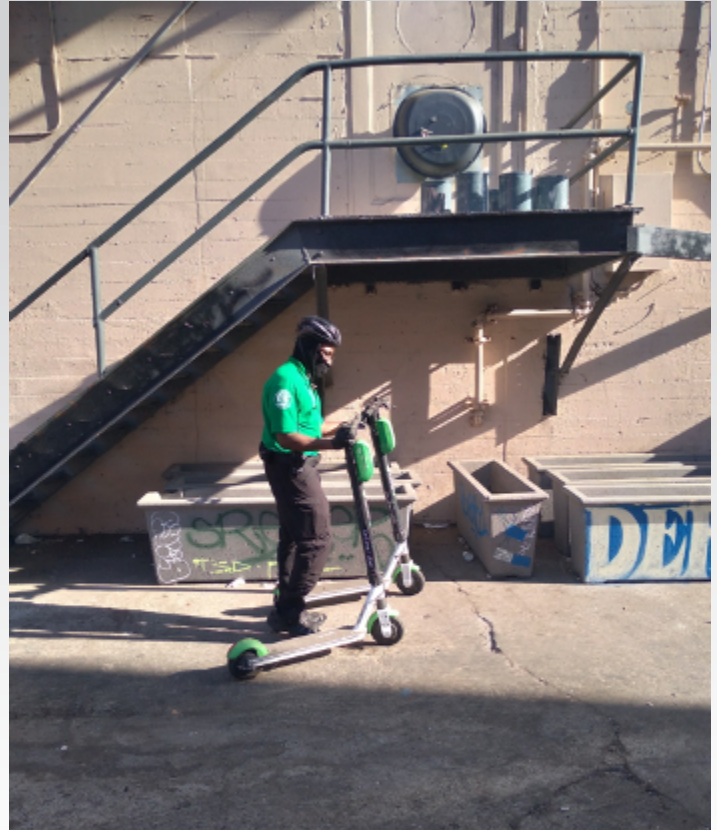

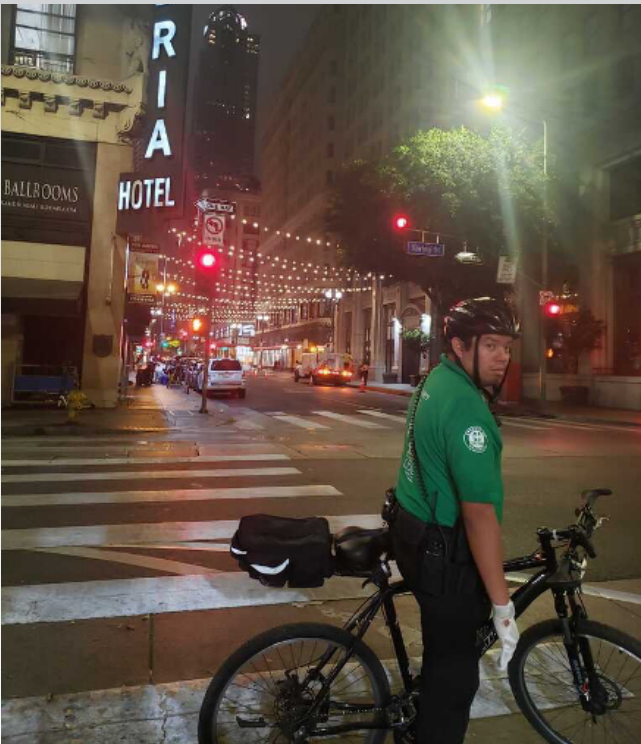
