

# Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | NOVEMBER 2020



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in November 2020. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**November 3rd** - At approximately 1140 hours, BID officers were on their routine patrol when they noticed heavy police activity within the corner of 7th and Broadway. BID officers soon discovered that a robbery and homicide had taken place at 704 S Broadway. LAPD quickly contained the scene and tasked BID officers to locate possible footage. Local merchants were very concerned and extremely cooperative by offering their own camera footage to LAPD. As a result, the suspect got away, but LAPD detectives were able to identify the individual thanks to the camera footage from CVS on 7th and Spring.

**November 5th** - While on his routine patrol, BID officer Royce Ajaa was flagged down at 536 S Spring Street regarding an unresponsive individual. Officer Ajaa further assessed the individual while providing basic aid. After a few minutes of assessing the individual, Officer Ajaa placed a support call to LAFD. LAFD arrived within minutes and provided advanced support. Still unresponsive but breathing, LAFD decided to transport the individual to the nearest hospital for unknown causes.

**November 14th** - BID officers were conducting regular foot beats among the corner of 6th and Spring when they observed a distressed individual at about 1255 hours. The individual approached BID officers and told them that he had been shot and needed help. BID officers assessed the individual by providing preliminary aid and placing service calls to LAPD and LAFD. Both agencies arrived quickly on scene and were able to stabilize the individual. LAPD detectives were also called on scene due to the nature of the crime. BID officers stood by until they were properly cleared by LAPD. The individual was transferred to the hospital shortly after and was expected to make a full recovery. No suspects were apprehended at the time.

**November 14th** - Sergeant Ramos received a citizen notification alert regarding possible shots fired. BID officers then rushed to the scene and met with LAPD at 117 Winston Street. LAPD notified BID officers that the situation was under control and that there were no victims. LAPD also told BID officers that the shots fired were confirmed and originated from two couples arguing in the parking lot. The suspect fired into the air and did not shoot at anyone. LAPD continued their investigation and cleared BID officers from the scene. VICE detectives also showed up and conducted their own investigation.

**November 15th** - While on their routine patrol, BID officers Cervantes and Carmona noticed heavy LAPD activity on the Northeast corner of 7th and Broadway. Upon arrival, BID officers discovered that an elderly pedestrian was the victim of a violent hit and run. The victim had been transported by LAFD in critical condition. BID officers gathered information and passed it along to nearby merchants in an effort to locate footage. A BOLO was generated by LAPD a few days later and distributed across major news outlets. At this point, the BID was notified that the victim had passed away from their injuries. After the news story was released, the suspect turned themselves in at the police station.

**November 20th** - BID officers received a citizen notification regarding a domestic disturbance at 4th and Spring around 1400 hours. When BID officers arrived, LAPD had already closed off the street and advised them that they had an active hostage situation. BID officers were then tasked by LAPD to conduct crowd and traffic control. BID officers remained on scene for a few hours and observed LAPD bring in crisis negotiators and their SWAT unit. After numerous failed attempts to deescalate the situation, the SWAT unit took over and took down the suspect forcefully. BID officers were then cleared from the scene and advised that the situation was under control.

#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**November 7th** - Throughout the entire day, post-election protests were observed entering in and out of the district. Most of the protests were observed in the afternoon and early evening hours. BID officers were in constant communication with LAPD's command post for the duration of the protests. All of the information that was relayed was significant and played a key role in minimizing property damage and vandalism. BID officers followed protests routes from a safe distance and communicated their findings back to LAPD. As a result, the BID was not affected by property damage. The BID did receive small acts of vandalism but was quickly corrected by the maintenance team the following days.

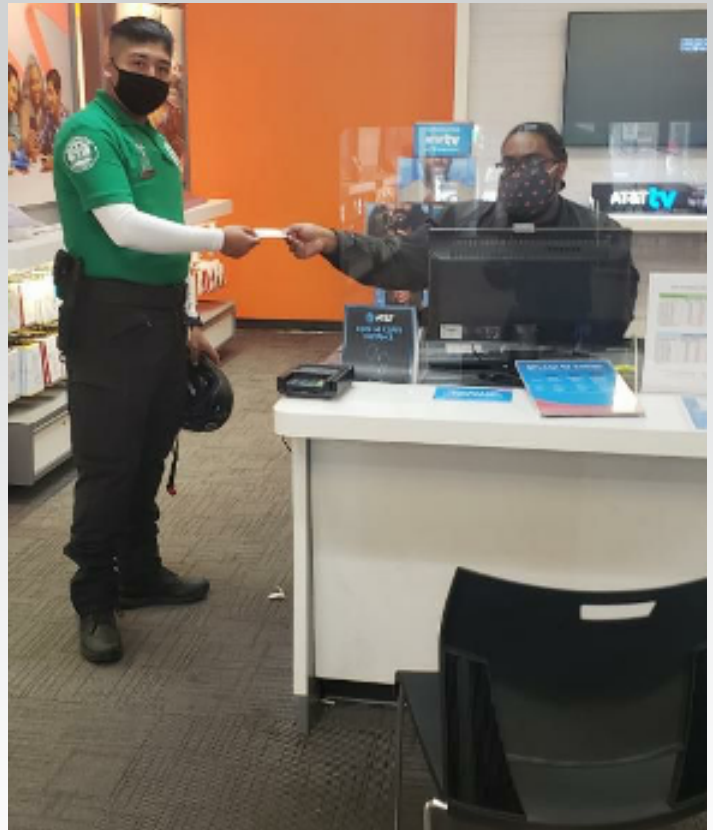

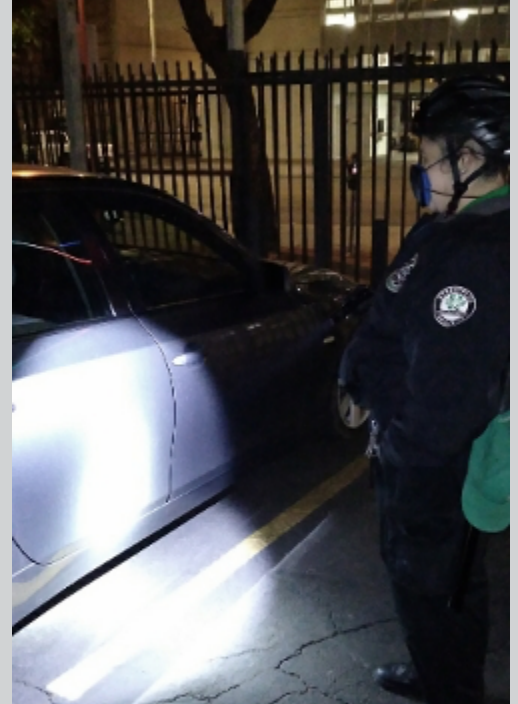

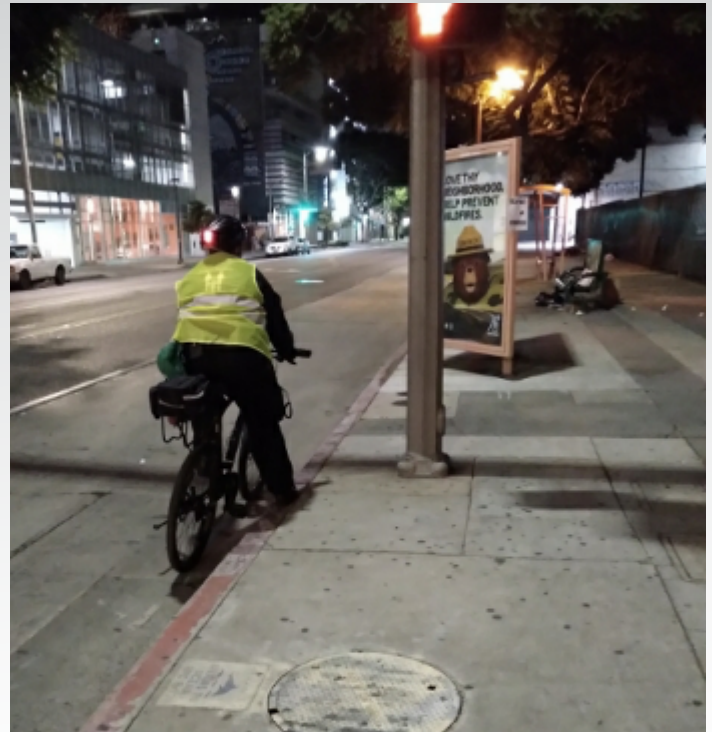
