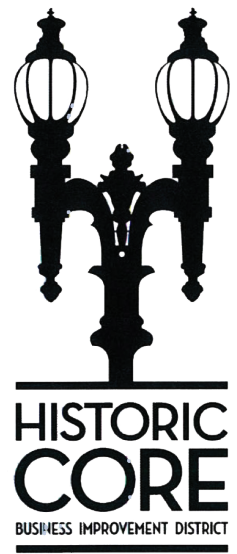


Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | MARCH 2021



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in March 2021. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.



Welcome to the Historic Core! Meet our public safety team.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

Mar 2nd - At approximately 0513 hours BID officers Carmona and Mercado received a citizen notification alert regarding a possible fire at 550 S Main street. BID officers made their way over to the location and found LAFD at the scene. FD went into the building and conducted their own investigation. Within a few minutes FD came out and communicated with BID officers the nature of the call. FD determined that the call was a false and was activated by faulty alarm. BID officers stood by momentarily and cleared the scene with LAFD.

Mar 6th - While on patrol, at 0815 hours, BID officers Benson and Cervantes received a service call for a small crowd gathering over at 6th and Broadway. Upon arrival BID officers Benson and Cervantes noticed LAPD taping off the scene. LAPD notified BID personnel that there was a possible jumper situation. BID officers were then tasked to assist with crowd control. After a lengthy standoff, LAPD managed to apprehend the individual without incident. BID officers remained on scene and were cleared by LAPD shortly after.

Mar 15th - At about 2200hrs, while on patrol, BID officers Cervantes and Ajaa noticed an homeless individual on the corner of 7th and Broadway acting erratically. BID officers monitored the individual's behavior closely and decided to intervene once the subject entered 701 S Broadway. The subject refused BID officers command to come outside and continue to cause a disturbance. LAPD was dispatched to the scene shortly after. LAPD arrived within minutes and made contact with the subject. After evaluating the individual, LAPD determined that the subject posed a threat to harm himself or others. LAPD then took the subject in without incident for a 5150 hold. BID officers also received an incident number in the event that the subject returns to the same area.

Mar 18th - Shortly after shift change, BID Sergeant Ramos and BID officer Smith went on patrol and located a business with broken glass at 542 S Broadway at approximately 0712 hours. BID officers inspected the exterior of the business for further damage and found that the back gate was still intact. BID officers stood by until LAPD arrived. A report was made and the business owner was also contacted. Since the back gate was still intact, the business owner was in no rush to repair the window. BID

officers were also cleared from the scene. The window from the business was eventually boarded up later on throughout the day.

Mar 19th - At approximately 0830 hours, BID officer Cervantes was flagged down by a citizen who pointed out a female subject causing a disturbance. BID officer Cervantes observed the subject's movements and identified what appeared to be a gun in her hand. Cervantes quickly called for backup and placed a service call to LAPD. LAPD came out and identified the female subject in question. While detained, LAPD was able to recover the item from her hand. After further examining the object, LAPD confirmed that it was an active gun. LAPD took the subject in without incident and arrested her on brandishing charges.

Mar 24th - At approximately 1643 hours, BID Sergeant Castaneda was on patrol when he noticed a parked vehicle causing traffic among the corner of 7th and Spring. Castaneda was able to locate a female driver who was passed out. While making contact with the driver, BID Sergeant Castaneda smelled a strong odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle. Empty beer bottles were also located on the passenger side. The keys were easily retrieved with the consent of the driver. LAPD traffic was dispatched to investigate. As a result, the woman was taken in for DUI and her vehicle was impounded from the busy intersection.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Mar 12th - At about 1700hrs, BID Sergeant Castaneda received a citizen notification regarding a robbery and possible carjacking incident over at 215 W 5th street. LAPD was also on scene upon arrival. BID Sergeant Castaneda made contact with LAPD and confirmed that the incident took place as described. A report was made by LAPD and all parties departed the scene. Senior lead officers came to the BID office a few days later and asked for camera footage. The BID cameras captured the entire incident including the carjacking moment. Footage was then given to LAPD senior lead officers. Senior lead officers also confirmed that the suspect was in custody. The footage downloaded will be used for the upcoming legal proceedings.

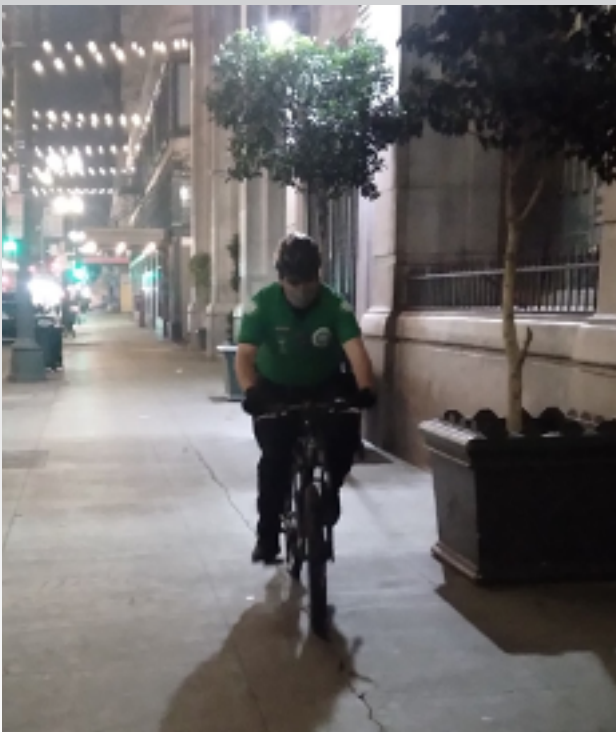

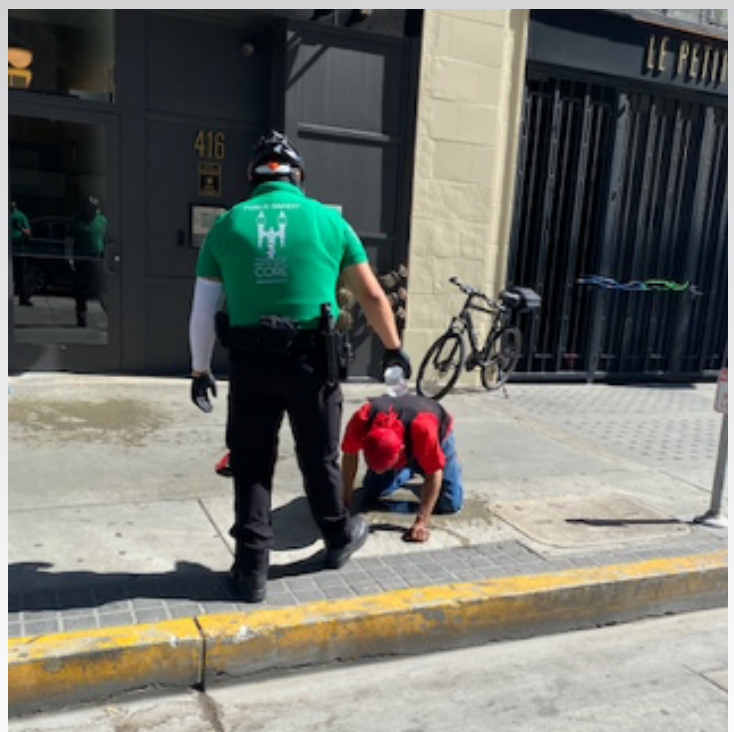
BID officers also carry first aid kits while on patrol.

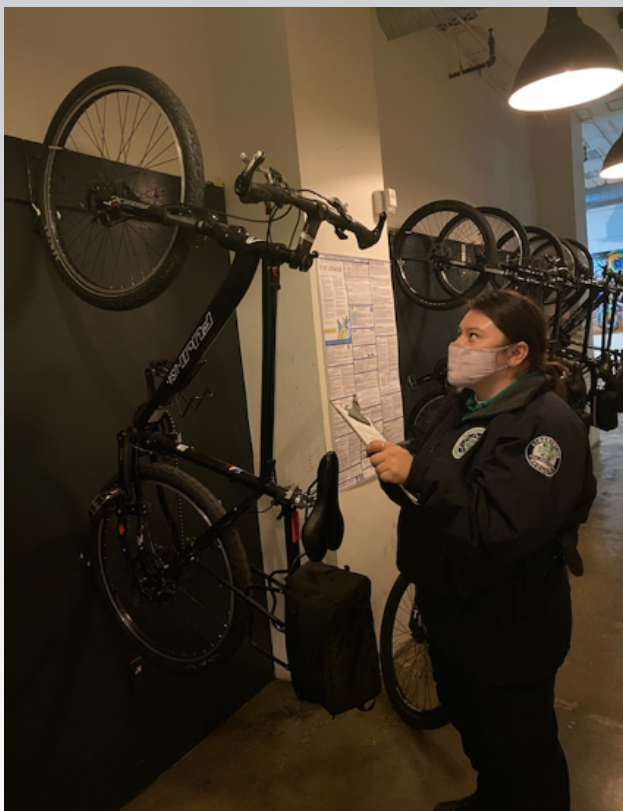
