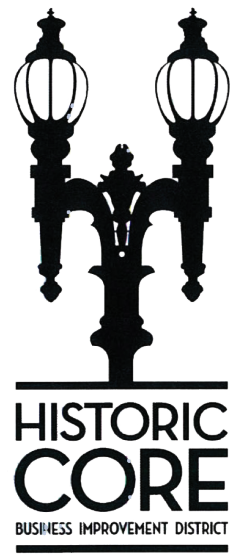


# Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | APRIL 2021



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in April 2021. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**April 3rd** - At around 0933 hours, BID officers Cervantes and Benson were on their routine patrol when a citizen flagged them both down at 6th and Main. The concerned citizen pointed out that there was an individual a few businesses down who appeared to be under the influence of drugs. BID officers quickly identified the subject in question and attempted to make contact. During this contact, the subject became agitated and began to run in and out of traffic. BID officers then attempted to gain compliance through verbal commands but were unsuccessful. A service call was placed to the LAPD. Upon arrival, LAPD officers identified the subject and noticed he had caused damage to a couple of vehicles. Officers took the subject into custody for felony vandalism.

**April 5th** - At approximately 1248 hours, BID Sergeant Ramos received a service call regarding an unresponsive individual at 514 S Spring street. As PSO Ramos arrived on scene, he located the unresponsive individual and attempted to make contact. The subject was not moving and was also having difficulty breathing. A service call was placed to LAFD instantly. While on the phone with the operator, Ramos was instructed to perform CPR. Ramos began conducting chest compressions and was relieved by paramedics shortly. Still in an unresponsive state, paramedics transported the individual in an unknown condition.

**April 11th** - At about 0850 hours, BID officer Cervantes received a call from Spring Street park regarding an individual with a sword. PSO Cervantes advised the caller to notify LAPD as he made his way to the scene. Upon arrival, PSO Cervantes waited outside of the park until LAPD arrived. Once LAPD arrived, they immediately took over the scene and attempted to gain compliance from the subject. After a short verbal standoff, the suspect dropped the sword and was taken into custody without incident. The sword was also confiscated and processed as evidence by the LAPD.

**April 19th** - BID officers Perchlak and Novales observed an active watch during the night shift as there were two notable incidents. The first incident occurred at 0200 hours on the corner of 6th and Spring. BID officers were on their routine patrol when they noticed a lot of police units within the area. Multiple LAPD officers had one vehicle pulled

over and one suspect in custody. The second incident occurred at 0413 hours at 5th and Main street. Paramedics and officers were on scene treating an individual. The incident appeared to happen indoors. BID officers were notified by fire personnel that the individual had been stabbed but was in stable condition. BID officers were then cleared by LAPD to resume patrol.

**April 23rd** - At approximately 1750 hours, BID officers were on their routine patrol when they noticed the intersection of 4th and Spring blocked off by LAPD. Bomb squad units were also on scene. BID Sergeant Castaneda made contact with an officer and was notified that bomb squad officers were investigating a suspicious device. BID officers were also advised to clear the area for their safety. BID officers were also tasked to turn pedestrian traffic away from the intersection. After a lengthy hour, bomb squad officers determined that there was no active threat. The intersection was cleared shortly after and BID officers continued their patrol.

**April 24th** - At approximately 1324 hours, BID officer Cervantes was on his routine patrol when he came across a citizen app notification on his phone. There was a stabbing that occurred on 5th and Crocker street while the suspect was last seen traveling westbound into the district. Cervantes communicated his traffic with other BID officers and were on high alert as a result. At approximately 1350 hours, LAPD were able to locate the suspect in front of 211 west 5th street. The suspect was taken into custody by officers without any incident.

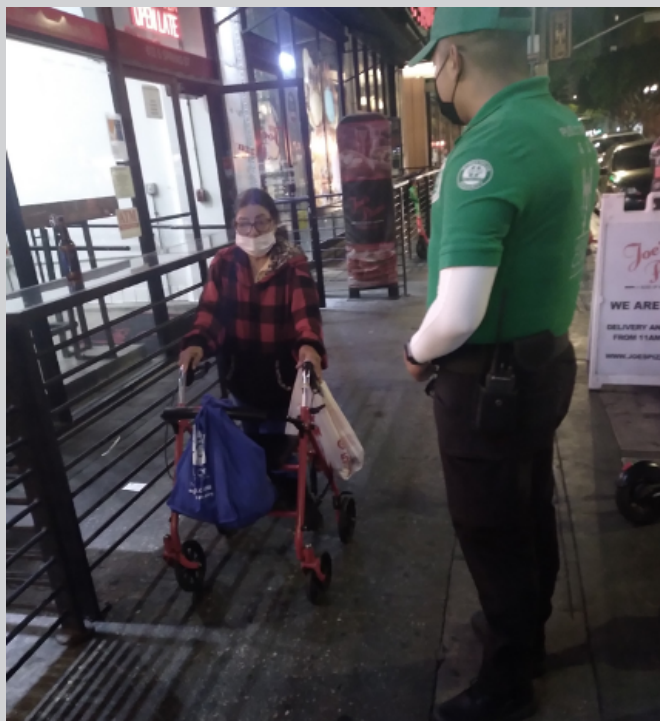
#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

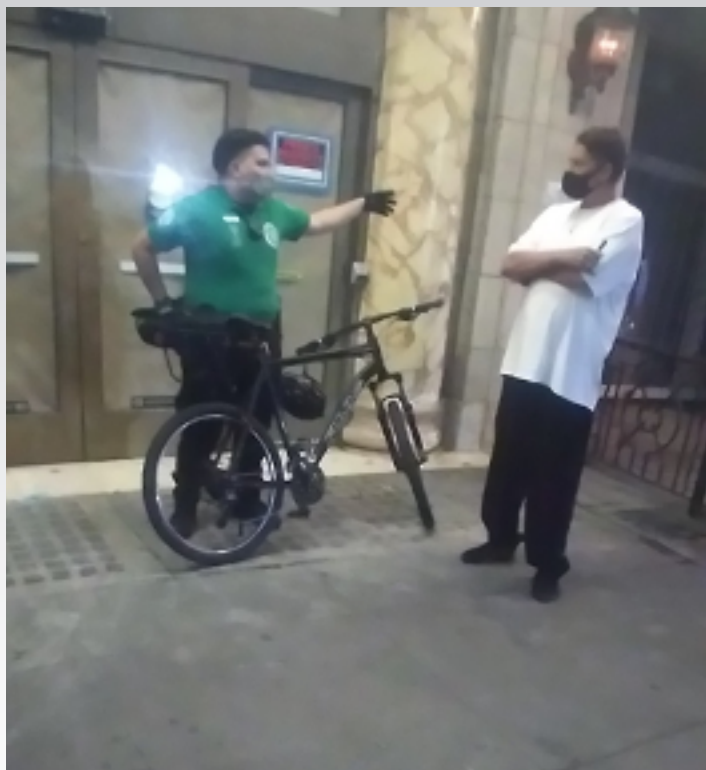

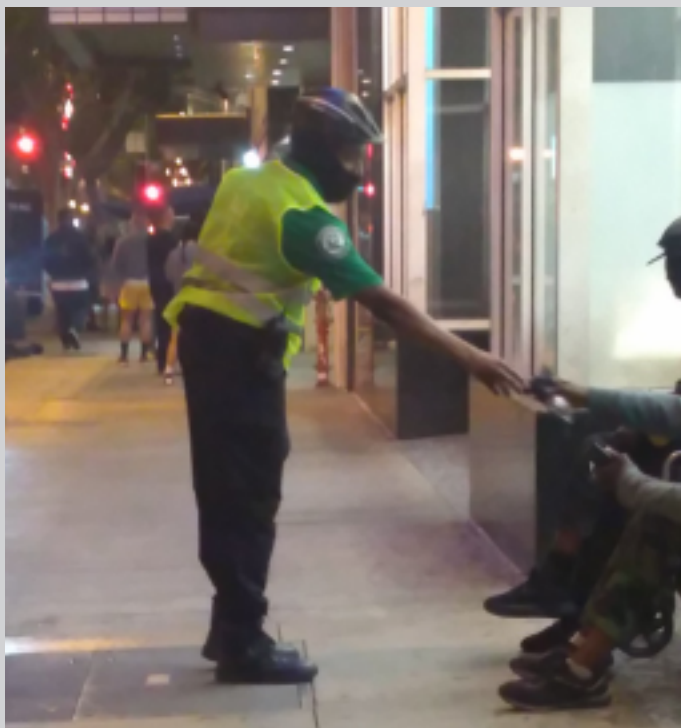

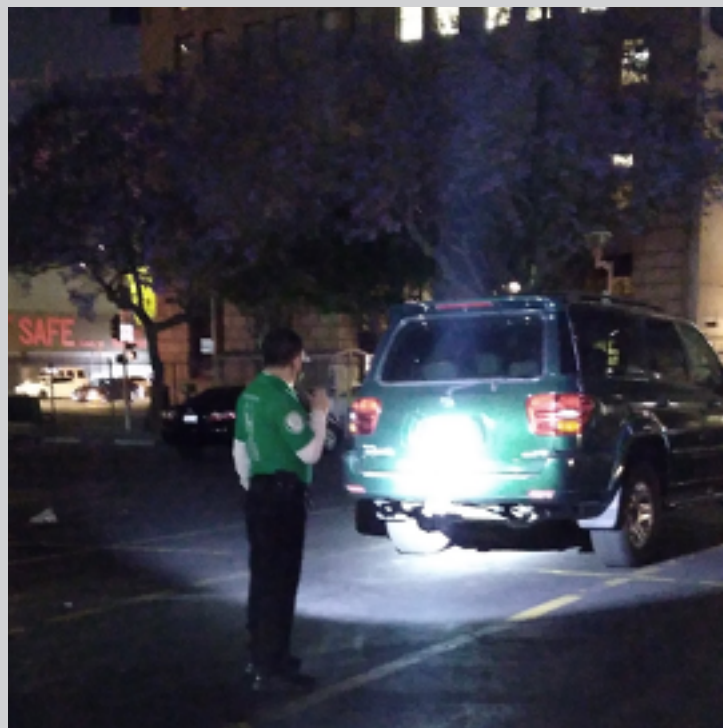

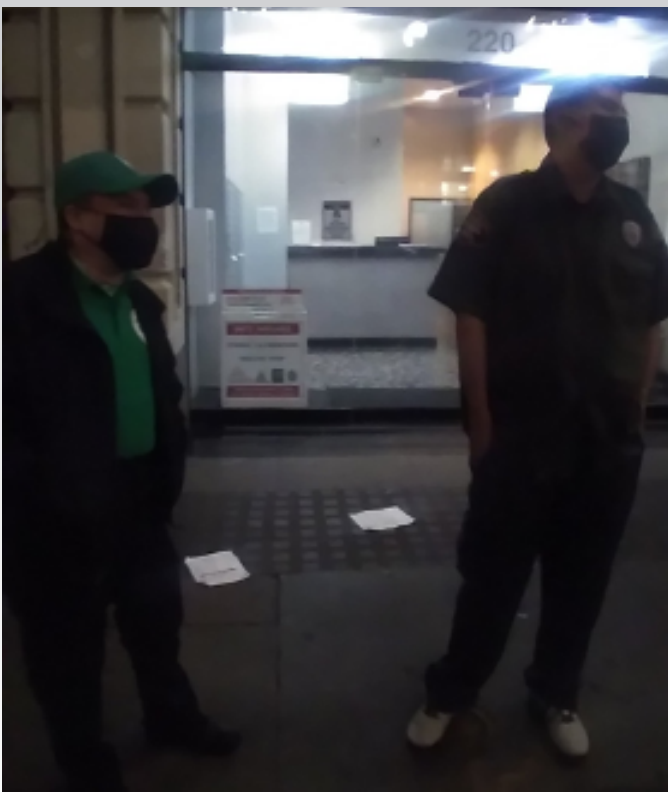
*BID officers can also assist with providing directions in and outside of the district.*



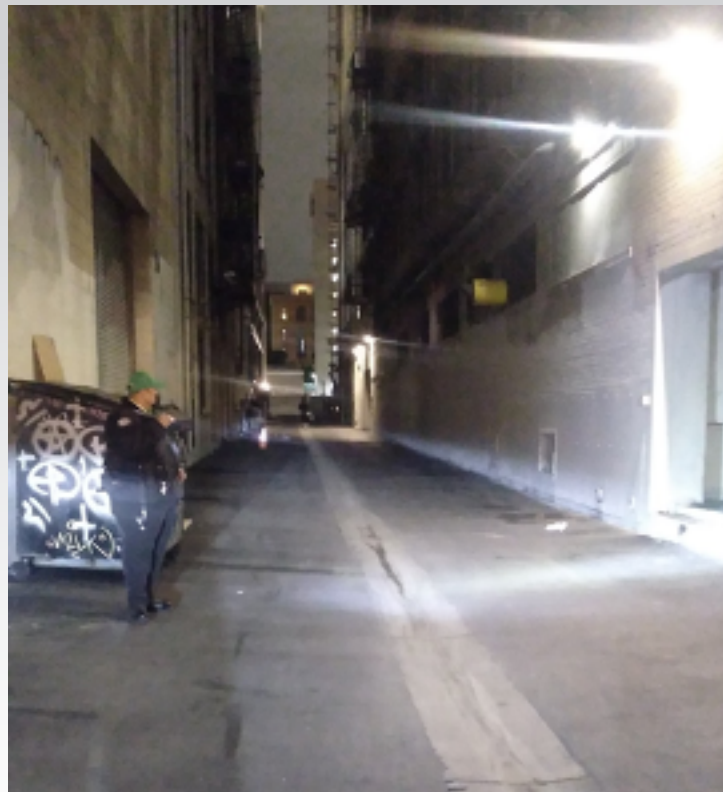

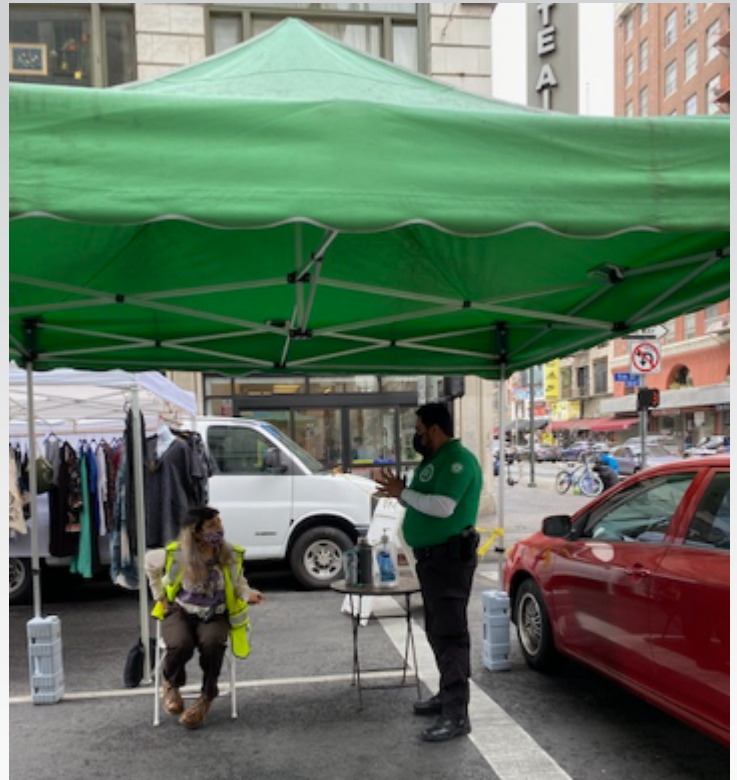
*BID officers put out a total of 4 small fires for the month of April.*
