The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in January 2022. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

January 1, 2022 - At around 2043 hours, BID officers Ballesteros and Banuelos were patrolling on 5th and Broadway when they observed a large police presence in front of 207 west 5th street. BID officers proceeded to approach the area with caution and observed the situation from a safe distance. Apparently, there was an individual with an unknown object using it as a weapon against pedestrians passing by. LAPD officers took the suspect into custody without further incident. BID officers also remained on scene directing pedestrians around the police activity. Once LAPD conducted their short investigation, BID officers resumed their patrol around the area. January 7th-While on patrol at about 0500 hours, BID officers Pirir and Ramirez located a broken window at 8th and Broadway. LAPD and the manager of the shoe store were also on scene. BID officers were informed through the manager that approximately at 0400 hours, an unknown male drove up to the retail store, smashed the front window, gained immediate entry and took various items with him. At the moment, there was no clear description as to how the suspect may look. Later that day, BID officers informed surrounding retail stores about the burglary and advised them to be cautious of suspicious activity.

January 13th - At approximately 1113 hours, BID officer Carmona received a citizen notification regarding a possible demonstration at the corner of 4th and Broadway. Upon approaching the area, BID officer Carmona found a large number of demonstrations circling the state building on 4th and Broadway. He immediately called for assistance and all BID officers responded to the area. Fortunately for the team, it was a peaceful demonstration and they relocated north just outside of the district within a few minutes. BID officers assessed the area and took off shortly after once everything was under control.

January 15th- BID officers Garcia and Ramirez received a service call at about 0900 hours involving an individual who was attempting to set up a tent outside of spring street park. BID officers arrived within minutes and were able to locate the subject in question. After a few minutes conversating with the individual, he agreed to relocate from the area. The individual gathered his belongings and relocated northbound just outside of the district. BID officers remained on scene for a couple of minutes to ensure that the area remained clear of tents.

January 21st - At about 2100 hours, BID officers received a service call from Chrysalis regarding an individual who made criminal threats to one of their employees at Winston and Los Angeles Street. All BID officers responded in a priority manner to that location. Upon arrival, the suspect was gone and the employee was still on scene with their supervisor. LAPD was dispatched to take the report down. Once the criminal report was complete, BID officers escorted the worker back to the office and offered additional safety escorts to team members after their shift ended.

January 31st - While on patrol, BID officers observed heavy police activity within 7th and Broadway. The heavy police activity also attracted heavy pedestrian traffic to the area. BID officers assisted with minor crowd control duties and were cleared once the scene was under control. LAPD officers communicated with BID personnel that a possible shooting had occurred inside the residential unit and that the suspect was still at large. Given the following information BID officers patrolled the area with extreme caution for the next couple of hours. The following day, more details developed and the BID was informed that a homicide had taken place.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

January 2022 - Compared to the prior 2 years, the Historic Core BID has seen a reduction at the start of the year, in service calls, regarding quality of life issues. LAPD CompStat figures show 4-week totals with very minimal change. Although officers were dispatched to more wellness checks, other major crime categories had low figures this month.








