


Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | APRIL 2022



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in April 2022. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

April 1- At approximately 0022 hours, BID officers Banuelos and Harbour were on their routine patrol when they noticed a fire on the sidewalk by 5th and Los Angeles. Both BID officers contacted an additional unit to assist with putting out the fire. BID officer Novales showed up within minutes and was able to extinguish the fire without further incident. Apparently, someone had stacked up a bunch of cardboard boxes and set them on fire. As BID officers cleared the scene, they remained on high alert for any additional fires in the area.

April 7- At approximately 1935 hours, BID officer Aguilar received a service call for a wellness check over at the corner of 6th and Los Angeles. Upon arrival, BID officer Aguilar was able to locate the woman in question and attempted to make contact. Immediately, Aguilar noticed that the woman was choking on her own vomit and her face was turning blue. Aguilar placed the woman in a side recovery position in order to clear her airway. A 911 call was generated for EMS and they showed up instantly within minutes. Paramedics took over the scene and were able to stabilize the woman. As they were transporting the woman in a gurney, paramedics advised Aguilar that she was going through an apparent overdose.

April 10 - BID officer Novales and Harbour were patrolling their zone when they noticed 2 individuals fighting on the corner of Los Angeles and Winston Street. BID officers proceeded to make contact from a safe distance and were able to deescalate the situation instantly. However, both parties refused to leave the scene and claimed that they would fight again once BID officers left. BID officers remained on scene for a few minutes providing uniform presence and advising both parties of the possible legal consequences. Eventually, one of the individuals left the scene while the other got picked up from an unknown vehicle.

April 13 - BID officers Carmona and Harbour were patrolling the area among 4th and Spring Street when they heard an unknown number of individuals arguing. As they attempted to circle back in the area, BID officers heard a few shots ring out. BID officers took cover from a safe distance and contacted 911. LAPD arrived instantly and blocked off the area in search of the shooting suspects. Although no victims nor suspects were found, responding LAPD officers were able to locate spent shell casings on 4th street. BID officers were cleared from the scene shortly after and were advised by LAPD to patrol the area with extreme caution.

April 16 - At around 1927 hours, BID officer Ballesteros received a service call regarding an individual who was trespassing and harassing pedestrians at the parking lot located by 6th and Spring Street. BID officer Ballesteros responded to the call and was able to locate the individual in question. The individual is a transient and is well known among the neighborhood for causing similar disturbances. BID officer Ballesteros was able to gain verbal compliance from the transient and was able to relocate him without further incident. BID officer Ballesteros remained on scene for a few minutes to ensure he did not return back to the area.

April 23 - While attending a service call nearby, BID officers Banuelos and Aguilar heard a vehicle collision on the corner of 6th and Main Street. BID officers quickly made their way towards the intersection and found one vehicle that was disabled with the occupant still in it. BID officers proceeded to make contact and offer medical services to the occupant. The owner of the vehicle declined and was on the phone with LAPD dispatch. BID officers noted that it was a single vehicle crash and that the vehicle struck 2 parked cars. BID officers conducted traffic control for a few minutes until LAPD arrived on scene.

April 27 - BID officer Aguilar received a service call over at 5th and Broadway regarding a theft in progress. As BID officer Aguilar arrived on scene with multiple units, the suspect was gone. BID officers made contact with the store manager and was told that he was struck in the face by the suspect numerous times. Although the store manager declined medical services, LAPD was dispatched by BID officers. Once LAPD arrived on scene, they were able to pull camera footage from the store and were able to provide BID officers with a suspect description. LAPD also tasked BID officers to contact 911 if the suspect was spotted again throughout the area.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

As we concluded the month of April, weather conditions were lower than usual which resulted in colder nights. In return, this created additional fire hazards among the homeless population. In order to stay warm, transients were starting up illegal fires on the sidewalks by burning cardboard, trash, and clothing items. Luckily for our team, they responded in a timely manner and were able to contain a total of 7 fires. The response time in these incidents is essential as the fires could easily spread to nearby buildings or create a safety hazard to pedestrians walk by the debris.



BID officers carry small fire extinguishers with them 24/7.




BID officers put out a total of 7 fires this month.
