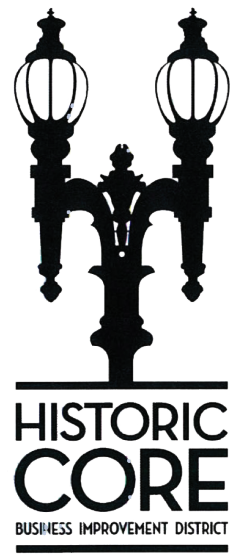


# Street Report

SAFE AND FRIENDLY | AUGUST 2022



The following data and information is provided to the Historic Core BID for tracking purposes. The information contained in this report is for activities reported in August 2022. The data and information is obtained from Ambassadors conducting patrols and entered in Statview.

#### SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

**August 1st** - At around 0212 hours, BID officer Novales and Castaneda were on their routine patrol when they came across 2 encampments on Main Street between 6th and 7th street. Prior to their patrol, BID officers had passed by the same area and observed it as clear. BID officers made contact with both encampments and asked them to relocate. At first, the occupants of the tents were being resistant. After several repeated attempts both tents were brought down through verbal compliance. The BID officer's persistence and uniform presence helped gain a favorable result.

**August 4th** - At about 1013 hours, BID officer Aguilar received a service call pertaining to an individual who was attempting to set up an encampment at 6th and Harlem alley. Upon arrival, the subject was cooperative and left the scene immediately. However, the subject left behind a bunch of trash and bulk items including a mattress and a couch. BID officer Aguilar coordinated with the clean team to remove all of the items from the location within the hour. In doing so, BID officers are able to prevent a resistant individual taking over the bulk items and refusing to leave.

**August 11th** - BID officer Dawson was on his routine patrol when he received a radio call for a man going in and out of traffic at 7th and Spring at around 1804 hours. Upon arrival, the subject became even more agitated and began throwing cones onto the street. BID officer Dawson was able to flag down an LAPD unit that was passing by. After explaining the situation, the marked unit pulled over and made contact with the subject. After a lengthy conversation, LAPD managed to relocate the subject away from the district. LAPD provided BID officer Dawson with an incident number and tasked responding BID officers to call 911 if the individual returned to the area.

**August 16th** - BID officers received a service call around 1003 hours at the corner of 6th and Spring involving two occupants. All units arrived on the scene after the fact and were able to locate the two individuals arguing with one another. Responding BID officers were able to diffuse the argument and gather statements

from each party. Although one individual was unwilling to leave the scene, the other party relocated willingly. BID officers provided uniform presence for a few additional minutes in the event that the other individual returned to the scene. Everything turned out to be okay as the other guy who remained on scene left the opposite way shortly after.

**August 21st** - While on his routine patrol, BID officer Harbour was flagged down by a retail store on 7th and Broadway at about 1519 hours. While making contact with the reporting party, the retail store stated that they were dealing with a shoplifting suspect 30 minutes prior. Before they could call in the illegal activity, the suspect took off running from the store in an unknown direction. Luckily, the retail store was able to capture a good image of the suspect via CCTV. The image was given to BID officer Harbour and distributed internally. All BID officers were made aware of the suspect's description and were on the lookout in the event that the suspect returned to the same retail store.

**August 25th** - At approximately 1213 hours, Outreach coordinator Cedric witnessed an individual who had a large abrasion to his head by 6th and Main. Cedric immediately contacted 911 and radioed in nearby BID officers. BID officer Gayle responded to scene instantly and helped provide preliminary aid with gauze pads. LAFD paramedics arrived shortly after and took over the scene. Due to the individual's state of being, LAFD decided to transport him to the nearest hospital. When asked, LAFD stated that the most likely scenario involved the individual coming to his own fall due to being in an impaired state.

#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS

**August 2022** - BID officers had two accomplishments for the month of August. First off, they were able to prevent 10 large encampments from setting up throughout the district. The other item involves their successful effort in picking up dropped scooters throughout the district. Both accomplishments addressed both quality of life concerns and safety hazards throughout the historic core district.

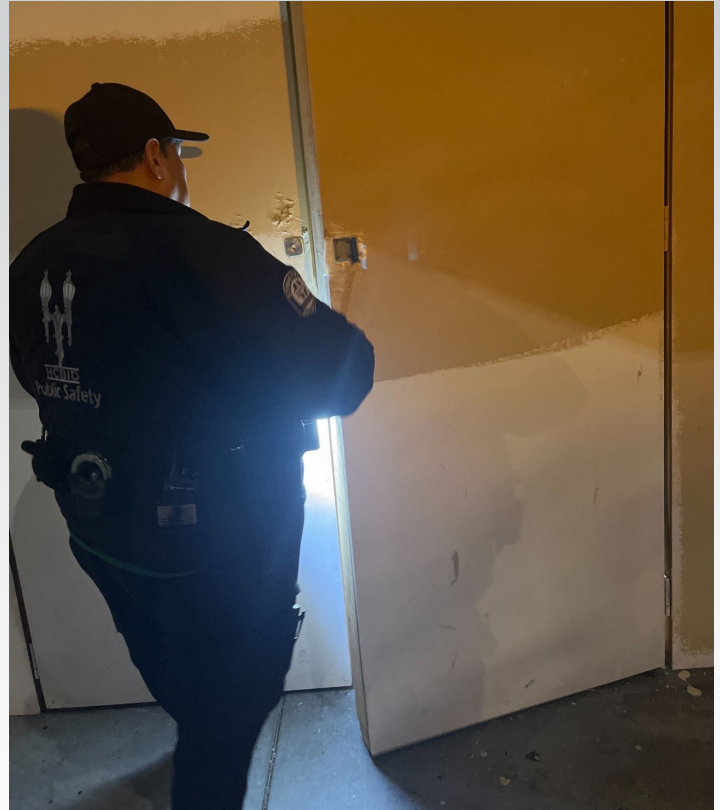

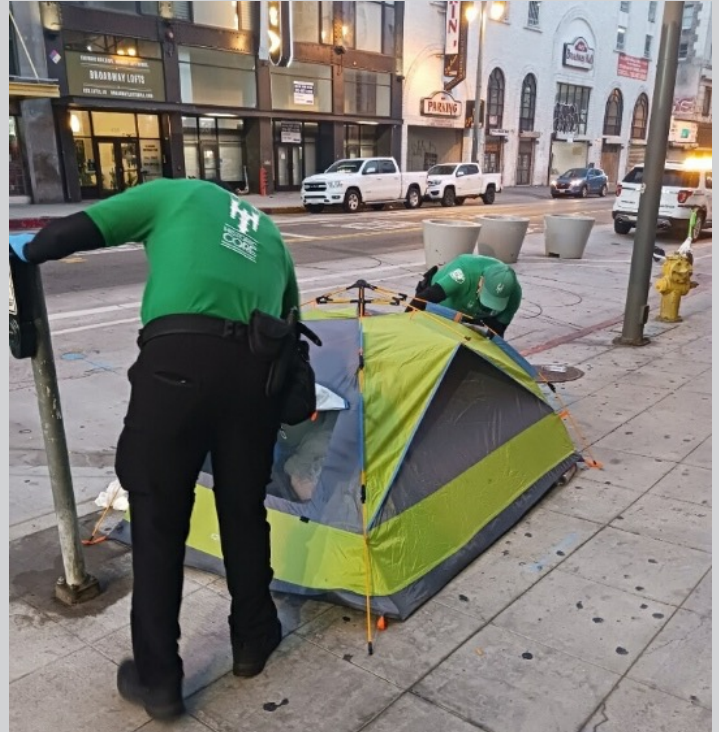
