SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS

September 2nd - At about 0146 hours, BID officer
Novales was on his routine patrol when he came
across a business that had their door slightly open by
the corner of 5th and Spring. Novales proceeded to
inspect the door for any signs of force entry. Luckily, the
business door was not tampered with and it appeared
as if someone forgot to lock it from the outside.
Novales then notified building security regarding
the incident in which they decided to take over. The
business owner was contacted and the door was
secured within the hour.

September 6th - At approximately 0429 hours, BID officer Novales and BID officer Herbert were conducting a wellness check on the corner of 6th and Spring when they smelled burning plastic. Both BID officers made their way towards the corner of 7th and Spring when they came across a dumpster fire. BID officer Novales took out the fire extinguisher from their patrol vehicle and quickly extinguished the fire. BID officers remained on scene for a few minutes looking for any suspicious indviduals. Once the area was cleared BID officers resumed patrol.

September 12th - BID officer Ajaa received a service call at around 1643 hours regarding a possible stolen vehicle on the corner of 5th and Spring. Upon arrival, BID officer Ajaa was able to locate the vehicle in question. A call was placed to parking enforcement and they were able to run the plate remotely. Although the vehicle was not stolen, it was blocking the entire bike lane. LADOT came out within the hour and cited the vehicle for parking in the bike lane. They also told BID officers that they would mark it down as possibly abandoned. As BID officers resumed patrol, they noticed that the vehicle was gone at around 1839 hours.

September 16th - At about 1646 hours, BID officer Banuelos was conducting a stakeholder check in at the nickel diner when the owner notified him that a few of the gates across the streets were not properly secured. BID officer Banuelos went over to check out the gates and located a few that had the wires snapped. Banuelos immediately notified the clean team and were dispatched instantly. The clean team were able to

successfully secure the gates using zip ties and wires. BID officers also made routine patrols among the area to ensure everything was locked and secured.

September 20th - BID officer Harbour received a service call at around 1335 hours regarding a woman who was in need of paramedic's services at 735 S Broadway. Upon arrival, BID officer Harbour located the woman and noticed that she appeared to be dizzy and disoriented. BID officer Harbour dispatched LAFD and offered the woman water while she waited. As paramedics arrived, they took over the scne and treated the woman on scene. Paremdics told BID officers that the woman was suffering from heat related illness and that the water that was provided to her helped stabilize the woman's current state. Once the woman was released and cared for by her party BID officers resumed patrol and gave the woman a business card in the event that she needs to call directly.

September 29th - At approximately 0907 hours, BID officers received a call about a stabbing that occurred right outside the state building located at 4th and Broadway. Once all BID officers arrived, the subject was being transported in stable condition and LAPD had the area taped off. BID officers learned from PD that the subject who was stabbed was a known transient in the area and the suspect was also in custody. The motive at the time was unknown but based on witness statements, they claim both parties were arguing prior to the stabbing. BID officers were cleared shortly after once all information was gathered for their report.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS



Business owners were then notified that same evening or the following morning regarding the situation. 
BID officers conduct saturated patrols during the late evening hours.

A BID officer is seen here securing an unsafe trip hazard.




Our Outreach coordinator averages about 5 walking miles each day offering resources when needed.




Scooters can also be a trip hazard. BID officers push them to the curb if spotted.



BID officers visit routine spots in an effort to address quality of life issues.




If manageable, BID officers will extinguish small fires throughout the district.


